FALL RIVER COUNTY MINUTES OF DECEMBER 20, 2016

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at the Fall River County Courthouse in the second floor courtroom. Present: Michael Ortner, Ann Abbott, Joe Falkenburg, Joe Allen, Deb Russell and Sue Ganje, County Auditor.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given and the meeting called to order at 9:00 AM.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; no conflicts were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Motion by Falkenburg, seconded by Allen to approve the agenda as written.

Motion by Russell seconded by Falkenburg to approve the minutes of December 6, 2016.

The Board took no action on the Auditor's Account until they talk with the Treasurer later in the meeting. County poor applicant, CP2016-17, did not attend meeting.

Motion by Falkenburg, seconded by Allen to approve CP2016-18, burial assistance, with a repayment plan of \$25.00 per month.

Motion by Abbott, seconded by Russell to surplus as junk the Treasurer's electric typewriter with asset tag # 1120.

Lyle Jensen, Building Supervisor met with the Board to present quotes from GoldenWest for more digital storage. Jensen gave an update on the ransom ware hacking that occurred last week. Jensen noted that a upgraded firewall would better protect the courthouse against further attacks. Motion by Abbott, seconded by Russell to approve the quote of \$1,374.00 from Golden West for additional offsite back up storage and set up fee, and \$\$5,231.00 for SonicWall NSA 2600 Secure Upgrade Plus, 3 Yr.

Julie Tomlinson, Auditor's Office, Payroll and Payables, met with the Board to advise them of Delta Dental's suggestion to move from the small group classification. Motion by Falkenburg, seconded by Russell to move out of the small group (25-50 employees) for Delta Dental coverage have rates based on experience rather than based on entire pool groups. There will be no change to coverage, with future rate increases protected by rate stability program.

Bob Evans, Sheriff met to discuss the negotiations for the 2017 Law Enforcement contract with the City of Edgemont that is up for renewal at year end, with Evans listing the requested changes. After discussion the board asked Evans and Barb Stozewski, Edgemont City Council and law enforcement committee representative, to work on certain language for her to take back to the Edgemont City Council.

Evans noted that the ankle bracelet contract is available and that training would be required.

Greg Foust of the Fall River Housing and Redevelopment Commission met with the Board to note the expiration of the 5 year position for Connie Gerard and recommend that she be

reappointed for another 5 years. Connie Gerard was also present and submitted a letter noting her desire to utilize her knowledge and experience and asking for consideration to serve another term. Motion by Falkenburg, seconded by Allen to appoint Connie Gerard to the Fall River Housing and Redevelopment Commission for a 5 year term.

Kelli Rhoe, Treasurer met with the board and answered questions on the Auditor's Account with the County Treasurer. Motion by Russell, seconded by Falkenburg to approve the Auditor's Account with the Treasurer for November 30, 2016.

Paul Nabholz, Commissioner elect, also met with Rhoe to present a FRC Investment Policy for commission review. Jim Sword, State's Attorney, noted it was the Treasurer's Policy, not the Commissioner's policy and that the Commissioners could make suggestions but the Treasurer was responsible for the investing. Ortner noted that commission input is important. Discussion on options and methods of investing followed. Falkenburg asked for a spreadsheet of options presented and Ortner would like a cost breakdown from possible investment firms. This item will be on the December 29th, 2016 agenda.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Management met with the Board to advise of the new timelines for Homeland Security grants. Maynard is working on generator sizing and noted that the RapidTag printer has arrived and training was held at the Courthouse. Maynard also spoke of the receipt of \$12,215.06 in SLA funds and \$20,469.69 for the keyless door lock security grant.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent met with the Board to present fuel bid as follows:

MG Oil \$1.7936/Gallon Nelson's \$1.86/Gallon PJ's No Bid

Motion by Falkenburg, seconded by Russell to approve the bid from MG Oil and Gas as the low bid at \$1.7936 per gallon for 8,000 gallons of E1087 fuel.

Seiler noted that the Highway Department worked over the weekend to remove snow from the blizzard the prior day.

Dustin Ross of Andersen Engineering met with the Board to present a plat for the Shagla's and Bent Pine Ranch. Ortner noted that Patrick Ginsbach of Farrell, Farrell and Ginsbach was hired by John Stanley, and Stanley had objections to the Shagla plat. The plat was tabled until December 29, 2016.

Black Hills RC&D 2016 Accomplishments

2016 was a year of successful mountain pine beetle collaboration and action among many stakeholders living and working in the Black Hills of Northeastern Wyoming, and Western South Dakota.

In an effort largely unmatched throughout the country, private landowners, County Weed and Pest Departments, Resource Conservation Districts, and State Federal Agencies have joined together in a collaborative "all lands" approach to combat the current mountain pine beetle epidemic.

This collaboration has resulted in the Black Hills Regional Mountain Pine Beetle Strategy, a five-year strategy for responding to the current epidemic in both Wyoming and South Dakota. There is a tremendous spirit of cooperation behind the work that is being accomplished. The larger Black Hills community of Wyoming and South Dakota is working together to slow progression of the mountain pine beetle in the Hills.

The State of South Dakota is providing technical assistance to private landowners in conjunction with a cost-share program for treating green-infested trees in select priority areas, and has held informational workshops in 2016. Custer State Park, used timber sales to thin forests at risk, and preventive sprayed high value trees. US Forest Service has completed both commercial and non-commercial harvest to improve timber stands in 2015. Through this cooperative effort 2016 surveys have shown a huge decline in MPB activity in the Black Hills.

The Spring Creek watershed project has been ongoing for over 10 years and BHRC&D involvement is to provide recommendations to the Pennington County Planning Department concerning the "Best Management Practices" concerning the Spring Creek project implementation and watershed management plan. In 2016 BHRC&D took on a larger role in this project by meeting with interested landowners to discuss projects that would improve and enhance this Black Hills watershed, with a partnership approach and partnership with Pennington County.

BHRC&D is also working with BARR Engineering on the implementation of a watershed management plan for the lower reaches of Spearfish Creek. This will be a collaborative effort with cities, irrigation districts, private landowners, and the public to improve the Spearfish Creek watershed.

BHRC&D received a Recreational Trails grant through Game Fish and Parks to create and implement a user trail ethics education campaign for users of trails on public lands in South Dakota. This cooperative effort with Off Road Riders Associations, SD Stock Growers Association, Black Hills Forest Resource Association, Black Hills Regional Multiple Use Coalition, Black Hills State University, US Forest Service, and other organizations to improve safety, and compliance with regulations concerning ATV-UTV operation on both public and private lands.

Dear Senator Thune,

Recent actions by President Obama have caused great concern for our part of America. During his Presidency he has made 29 designations for National Monuments that resulted in 554 million acres being placed off limits to development, grazing and other activities.

The tragedy of these designations are most felt in our Western states where many have vast amounts of public lands. The percentage of each state that is owned by the Federal Government is as follows: Nevada 76.1%, Utah 70.2 %, Idaho 60.5% Wyoming 55.9 %, Arizona 32.2%, Montana 26.5%, South Dakota 8.9%, Nebraska 2.8%.

These large public land holdings take vast sums of money from County tax basis. PILT or Payment in Lieu of Taxes monies for County government, assist and are greatly needed, but do not make up for private ownership dollars. Without the PILT money, many Western Counties would be bankrupt.

A quick look at lands declared National Monuments by various Presidents is quite enlightening. Starting with Franklin Roosevelt – 2,800,000 acres; Harry Truman – 23,000 acres; Dwight D. Eisenhower – removed 26,000 acres; John Kennedy – 26,000 acres; Lyndon Johnson – 360,000 acres; Richard Nixon – 0 acres; Gerald Ford – 90 acres; Jimmy Carter – 54,000,000 acres; Ronald Regan – 0 acres, George HW Bush – 0 acres, Bill Clinton – 5,700,000 acres; George W. Bush – 214,800,000 acres; Barack Obama – 554,590,000 acres. It would be my hope that some of these designations by President Obama could be reversed or eliminated.

We have three divisions of Government. All need to participate.

In recent times, environmentalists proposed a buffalo commons that would run from Canada to Texas, taking out all Federal land and some private land for a Lewis and Clark type park. Farfetched? Think again. This is the "fly over" section of the United States.
