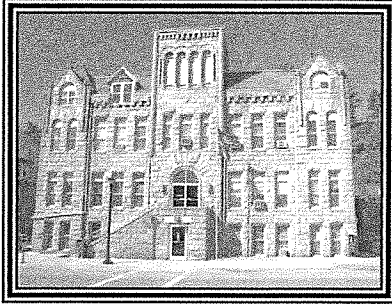

We understand that a request has been made by Prairie Hills Transit for a Discretionary Grant to build a 6-7,000 sq. ft. steel frame bus Facility in Hot Springs. This facility would be placed on approximately one acre of land which is currently owned by the City of Hot Springs.

The transportation service that is provided by Prairie Hills Transit is vital to all of Fall River County in the Southern Hills Region of South Dakota. These services are an essential link for many residents to access medical services, dialysis, grocery and senior meals programs and maintain the activities of daily living. The independence of our residents is important to the city and county and without accessible public transportation many would be forced to leave.

We understand that the potential project will receive 80% of it's funding from Federal sources if an investment of 20% is available and supported by cash, in-kind value of dirt, sewer, and water work or land donations.

We would support Prairie Hills Transit in their wish to have a facility in the Hot Springs community that would house three vehicles, have an office, restroom and garage drainage.

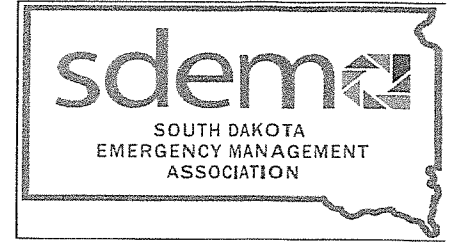

Subj: Commission Update

1. **2017 EMPG Subaward Agreement:** I am requesting approval to have the Chairman sign the Agreement. This agreement is for \$51,517.90 which represents the 50% match for the 2017 Emergency Management Program. (attachment)
2. **Court Security Grant:** Fall River County was awarded \$6,017.52 for the electric door locks, bench bullet proof shielding and metal detector. This amount represents 50% of the cost of the three items. (attachment)
3. **Drought:** Fall River County still does not meet the requirements for a drought disaster declaration. I will continue to monitor the situation and if the required level is reached, prepare the resolution for the Chairman to sign.
4. **Disaster Fund:** I am requesting consideration from the Commission of establishing a Disaster fund to allow for payments of fires, floods, etc. Currently, there is no account to pay these expenses, except the EM supply account.

LUCA – Local Update of Census Addresses Operation

This is a voluntary decennial census operation that gives local governments the opportunity to review and update the US Census Bureau's residential address list for their jurisdiction prior to the 2020 census. The Census Bureau relies on a complete and accurate address list to reach every living quarters and associated population for inclusion in the census.

Items for Action

1. Will the county participate in LUCA?
 - Recommendation: Yes. The census taker having correct addresses is a significant benefit for the county. When they have incorrect addressing they spend a great deal of time in our offices trying to obtain documentation for those inaccuracies.
2. Who will be the county Liaison?
 - Recommendation: Stacey Martin as GIS Coordinator. There are a number of requirements for safeguarding the data the census will provide for this project. The easiest way to insure that the confidentiality and security guidelines are met is to contain the data provided on one computer with controlled access.
3. Should we coordinate with city governments to assist with their LUCA operations?
 - Recommendation: Yes. The county's 911 address layer is the most complete dataset of addresses for our area. Our cooperation with local municipalities will greatly lessen the amount of time spent on this project and increase the accuracy of the final project. I am not recommending that we complete the LUCA for them but rather that we assist them with our data in the early stages of the project to pinpoint discrepancies between the census data and our local data. Coordinating with them will require that our liaison is listed on their confidentiality agreements as a reviewer.

Title to Property involved in the Chilson Bridge Bypass is held by Ellen Trevarton and Bruce and Linda Murdock

Conditions under which we would be willing to consider a Compensation Proposal from the Commissioners:

No sale of land, use will be for a Temporary Bypass only during construction of a new Chilson Bridge Structure- time limit of one year.

Bypass will be used for a road only, no access to any other facilities of any kind or for any other purpose other than a Road Bypass.

No Utilities and no Parking areas or any other use by the public will be allowed.

Bypass will be fenced on both the East and West side with a legal 4 wire fence. A temporary fence may be placed on the East side during road Bypass construction which will then be removed and replaced with the previous mentioned fences.

Width of Bypass to be the minimum width possible. 16 ft?

At completion of Project the Property and any and all improvements placed on Property will revert to Owners control and exclusive use.

Allen spoke on the Buffalo Gap and Oral Roads. Discussion on lowering the speed limit was held and a speed limit of 35 miles per hour for cars and 25 miles per hour for semi trucks was discussed. Seiler will investigate making the whole road 35 miles per hour to be discussed at the June 9, 2016 meeting.

Falkenburg mentioned to Seiler that the bridge on Scenic Road had a request to be chip sealed.

Public Comment was held at 10:20 am. Casey Neugebauer questioned the board on the red flags on Buffalo Gap Road. Seiler informed the Board it was where gravel is to be used.

More information was presented by Lyle Jenson on insurance for Richard Kraima. Ortner brought up the idea of paying for half of Kraima's insurance.

Motion by Russell, seconded by Abbott to move to executive session for personnel at 10:30 am. Exited executive session at 10:52.

Motion by Falkenburg, seconded by Allen to approve a wage increase for Edith Jenniges to \$13.00 per hour effective immediately.

The hearing for transfers and renewals of malt beverage permits was held as advertised.

Motion by Russell, seconded by Falkenburg to approve the transfer of the liquor permit from Breakers Beach Club to Inferno on the Beach for license # RB-2690.

There is along every section line in this state a public highway located by operation of law, except where some portion of the highway along such section line has been heretofore vacated or relocated by the lawful action of some authorized public officer, board, or tribunal.

31-25-1.1. Fences erected across unimproved section-line highways--Gates--Access to highways protected--Violation as misdemeanor. A landowner may erect a fence across an unimproved county, township, or section-line highway. For the purposes of this section an unimproved county, township, or section-line highway is any county, township, or section line not commonly used as a public right-of-way and never altered from its natural state in any way for the purpose of facilitating vehicular passage. At any point where a fence crosses such highway, the landowner shall erect and maintain an unlocked gate which may be opened easily or provide other suitable access to the highway. If the gate or other access is not large enough or if the gate does not open easily enough to satisfy the needs of those using the highway, the landowner shall erect a larger gate or a gate that can be more easily opened or provide other suitable access to the highway. The landowner shall erect the larger gate or the gate which opens easily or provide the other suitable access upon a request filed with the sheriff of the county in which the land is located by an adversely affected person. If a request is filed, the sheriff shall notify the landowner. The landowner shall comply with the provisions of this section within seven days of notice. A landowner who violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

So can you come up with the amount that is old verses new money (2009-2016)? On that form you do not report expenditures of the old money only the new money and you only report the amount of new money that is not obligated. So if for instance in the 2017 budget you budgeted 10,000.00 for expenditures that are proper under the new money (approved firewise programs or for search and rescue or fighting fires on forest lands) then you would report as the unobligated amount the cash balance of the new money less the 10,000.00. Of course to officially budget for the title III funds you should have had a 45 day comment period before the budget was adopted setting forth the plans of the county.

This letter is in follow up to our telephone conversation this morning regarding the distribution of energy mineral severance tax pursuant to SDCL 10-39A-8. The South Dakota Department of Revenue recently identified process errors that occurred between December 2015 and February 2017 while completing the reversion of energy mineral severance taxes to Fall River County. By offsetting these errors with the scheduled August 2017 reversion, the result is a net overpayment to Fall River County in the amount of \$37,479.59. I have attached an Excel spreadsheet showing how this amount was determined.

The issues causing these errors have been addressed, thereby greatly reducing the likelihood of similar errors going forward. The most expeditious way to resolve the matter is for you to send payment in the amount of \$37,479.59 back to the South Dakota Department of Revenue, Special Taxes Division, 445 E. Capitol Ave., Pierre, SD 57501.
