FALL RIVER COUNTY MINUTES OF JUNE 7, 2018

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on June 7, 2018 in the courtroom on the second floor of the Courthouse. Present: Ann Abbott, Joe Allen, Joe Falkenburg, Paul Nabholz, Deb Russell and Sue Ganje, Auditor.

The Pledge of Allegiance was stated, and the meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; no conflicts notes. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Abbott, to approve the correction to George Eberle's abatement from \$17.49 to abate \$65.60 and refund of \$4.38.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve the May 1, 2018 minutes.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Nabholz, to approve the May 15, 2018 minutes.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to deny the application request for statutory access easement for Horseshoe Partners as property now has new owners.

Lyle Jensen, Building Supervisor, met with the board. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Abbott, to approve the quote from Straight Line Striping, in the amount of \$750.37 for the handicapped areas and parking lots.

Discussion was held on a quote for the painting of the propane tank. Motion made by Russell, to approve the quote from L & B Dustless Blasting LLC in the amount of \$6,283.68. Motion dies from a lack of a second. The board asked that Jensen get more quotes.

Paul Nabholz, Commissioner, met with the board. Nabholz spoke of a letter he had sent to the 7th Circuit Presiding Judge, the Honorable Craig Pfeifle, about employees carrying guns in

the courthouse. Nabholz received a reply, advising that the letter will be reviewed in depth and let Nabholz know his thoughts. Nabholz and Jensen spoke of an informal survey of courthouse employees. Nine out of twenty employees would carry in the courthouse if they could. One would carry after getting training. Seven employees currently carry, but leave their guns in their vehicles when working in the courthouse.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Management, met with the board. Maynard participated in two webinars to maintain his certification as a Floodplain Manager, and then discussed the Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) training in Custer on June 14, 2018, as FEMA has shifted that responsibility to local entities. He also discussed recent heavy rains and the flooding and the road damage that occurred. Levels in streams and rivers have gone down and repairs are being completed. Maynard also updated the board on the Civil Unrest Annex, and producer assistance, which he will have more information on them later. Maynard reported on fires and two vehicle accidents and confirmed that there would be a SEAT plane located at the airport for the fire season.

Susie Simkins, Director of Equalization, met with the board. Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Allen, to approve the abatement for John V. and Patricia S. Weiss, parcel #75380-01800-00800, in the amount of \$689.54. Reason: Eligible for elderly freeze.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Nabholz to approve travel for Simkins and Caitlin Turner to Chamberlain June 26 and 27, 2018 to attend the Vanguard User Group training.

Simkins presented her final 2018 pay 2019 values, and the board reviewed her budget for 2019. Simkins will come to the next meeting to discuss budget staffing for next year.

Joe Falkenburg, Commissioner, met with the board to discuss private oil well drilling on the 4-3 Ranch (near the state line), Tom Simons and John Tanner. The concern is making sure the roads are kept in good condition during this project.

The following people met with the board for 2019 budget requests:

Howard also discussed the possibility of repairing the parking lot at the museum and the possibility of building an addition or a separate building. There has been an offer to pay for an addition to display historical items and paintings from the Hargen family. Randy Seiler will look at the parking lot, and a decision will be made later about the addition or separate building.

Break was taken at 10:05 a.m. Meeting resumed at 10:08 a.m.

No public comment was heard. The Board will come back to the Contingency transfer, supplement hearing.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the board and presented fuel quotes as follows:

Doug Kinniburgh, South Dakota Local Government Assistance, met with the board to provide documentation of Fall River Projects from 1991-2018. Kinniburgh addressed the current projects in the county. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Nabholz, to approve Amendment #1 to Agreement #715993, for Bridge Improvement Grant for preservation of Structure #24-029-04 (Burdock Bridge) and authorize the chairman to sign.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve the request for design exception from the 10 year flood, Agreement for Bridge Improvement Grant for Preliminary Engineering Agreement, Structure #24-020-020 and authorize the chairman to sign.

Update was given on Project P 0043(00) Provo to Igloo Roadway Design, from SD471 at Provo W and NW to Igloo, approximately 2 miles, noting estimated completion date of 10/15/2020 for an at-grade crossing at Provo. This is a state funded project.

Discussion was held on the Chilson Bridge project. An at grade crossing had been decided upon during a previous meeting, with an existing Joint Powers Agreement with the State. All options that were presented initially would have had similar costs. Comments were heard from the audience, most of them preferring a bridge option. Linda Murdock, area land owner that would be affected by the at-grade crossing option, would prefer using the money for culverts in other areas of the county, but would prefer a bridge if that is the choice. Nabholz thinks that it is a waste of money to pay the ongoing cost for a bridge. He would like the board to consider talking to Jim Miller about an at grade crossing or the possibility of condemning the ROW. This may not be an option if traffic had to be diverted from the main highway. Kinniburgh noted if the plan is changed to a bridge, the timeline will be extended for a year. Falkenburg got consensus from those in the audience, which was to build the bridge.

Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Allen to build a new bridge in the Chilson area. With a roll call vote and Nabholz voting no, all others voting yes, motion carried.

The hearing for Contingency Transfers and Supplements was held. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the following resolution for the supplement hearing and contingency transfer:
