## FALL RIVER COUNTY APPROVED MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 8, 2018

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on November 8, 2018 in the courtroom on the second floor of the Courthouse. Present: Ann Abbott, Joe Allen, Joe Falkenburg, Paul Nabholz, Deb Russell (via teleconference) and Sue Ganje, Auditor.

The Pledge of Allegiance was stated, and the meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS ROLL CALL VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Abbott, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to approve the minutes of October 16, 2018.

Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Russell, to approve the surplus of an auditor's office laptop, #01857, to junk.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to amend the October 2, 2018 minutes, to reflect 800 gallons of propane, instead of 8,000 gallons. With Allen voting no, all others voting yes, motion carries.

Ganje met with the board to express thanks to all the individuals who worked on Election day, it was a super effort from our residents.

Andersen Engineers did not meet with the board as taxes were not paid on the plat noted on the agenda.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Management and Stacey Martin, GIS, met with the board. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Nabholz, to approve the purchase of a L2Y22A HP Designjet T930PS ePrinter Daycad in the amount of \$2,995.00.

Maynard updated the board about FEMA training in professional development services.

Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Russell, to approve a quote from Rushmore Communications Inc. for EOC radio install at the South Annex in the amount of \$1,058.25.

Maynard notified the board that the Threat Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) has been completed; it is a requirement for homeland security grants. Also, the tracks for the Pioneer side x side, as approved by the Homeland Security grant, have been installed and paperwork has been submitted for reimbursement. Paperwork for the LEPC grant has been sent. A map of the fire threat in the county was presented and \$750.00 was received for the Hazard training.

Nabholz spoke of a Hot Springs Fire district meeting he attended. Maynard noted training and rules required for responders, according to NWCG guidelines.

Bob Evans, Sheriff, met with the board. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Abbott, to approve the Contract for Housing of Prisoners and Detainees in the Pennington County Jail for 2019 at \$80.00 per day.

The hearing for sealed bids on the 3 year land grazing lease was held as advertised. Bids were received as follows: Jackson Cunningham, 346 S 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Hot Springs, SD 57747 - \$962.40 per year, and Ben and Becky Reutter, PO Box 140, Edgemont, SD 57735 in the amount of \$1,000.00 per year. Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Allen, to accept the high bid from Ben and Becky Reutter at \$1,000 per year for three years. Falkenburg noted that he would like to re-visit the contract in the future to consider selling the land and reserving the gravel.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the board. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Abbott, to approve the October 2018 fuel used or work performed to reimburse the highway department as follows: Weed & Pest for \$209.02; Sheriff's Department for \$2,862.62; Building for \$128.04; Emergency Management for \$105.92; Director of Equalization for \$187.63; GIS for \$106.42; State's Attorney for \$25.46; and Election for \$61.11.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to approve the Golden West Telecommunications application for permit to occupy county highway right-of-way from an existing vault at the intersection of Argyle Rd. and Sapphire Ln to the power line located northwest of the driveway at 12908 Argyle Rd.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Nabholz, to approve the Golden West Telecommunications application for permit to occupy county highway right-of-way from 13201 E Southshore Road (Trails End Ranch, Daniel Gillespie) to west 120' (more or less) to private gate.

The board reviewed fuel bids as follows:

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Nabholz, to approve the low and only bid from Nelson's Oil & Gas Inc for \$7,000 gallons of #2 dyed diesel in the amount of \$2.72 per gallon, for a total of \$19,040.00.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Nabholz, to approve the application by Diann Long for a road approach permit for a connection to the right side of Smithwick Road #1 approximately ½ mile west of Cemetery Road to serve a residence.

Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Nabholz to approve taking a road tour on November 20, after the regular commission meeting, weather permitting.

Seiler updated the board on traffic counts and that Barker Concrete and Construction, Inc. was working on moving rocks off Old Highway 18 to north of Edgemont. Seiler also advised of a request from Linda Murdock for gravel on Pine Hill road SE of Edgemont. The board agreed that if Murdock provides the gravel the county will spread it.

The hearing for the vacation of ROW, as petitioned by Michael and Regina Eichenberger was held as advertised. Mike Ortner, Attorney, and Michael and Regina met with the board. A written protest by Michael Irwin was presented which advised that vacating the ROW would leave him landlocked. Discussion was held that Irwin was not given a guarantee of access when he purchased the land at a county tax deed sale, and that there was a section line that Irwin also had access to. It was also noted that the existing terrain made building an access would be difficult for Irwin, but Ortner advised that Michael and Regina would grant a permanent pedestrian easement to Irwin, which would be added to the resolution. A document providing Irwin physical access within 30 days of the second publication. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve the following resolution:

# Resolution and Order vacating certain right-of-way in Fall River County, South Dakota.

Whereas, Michael T. Eichenberger and Regina R. Eichenberger, husband and wife, have heretofore presented to the Fall River County Commission, pursuant to SDCL 31-3-23, a petition for vacation of a portion of right-of-way described as follows:

Dedicated right-of-way (.568 acres, more or less) lying between Tract E in the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter(NE1/4SE1/4NE1/4) of Section 34, Township 7 South, Range 5 East of the Black Hills Meridian, Fall River County, South Dakota, as shown in Book XVII of Plats, page 32 and a parcel of land formerly known as Lot 11R of Country View Subdivision located in the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4NE1/4) of Section 34, Township 7 South, Range 5 East of the Black Hills Meridian, Fall River County, South Dakota as shown on Plat filed in Book XI of Plats, page 5, subject to any easements and right-of-way presently existing for public utility or drainage purposes.

Which petition made by the Owners of all the property adjoining both sides of the said right-of-way proposed to be vacated sets out that said right-of-way has not been constructed or used as a right-of-way or road at any time during the past 40 years and which petition was signed by the petitioners, and said right-of-way is less than 500 feet in total length and no public highway is part of the right-of-way to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, Petitioners acquired title to said right-of-way by Quit Claim Deeds from the adjoining land owners over 20 years ago and have paid the property taxes thereon for the past 20 years: and

WHEREAS, the Fall River County Commission at a meeting of said Commission held October 2, 2018, deemed it expedient that said matter should be proceeded with, ordered said petition filed with the Auditor of said County, fixed a time for hearing on the petition at the regular meeting of the Commission on Thursday, November 8, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. and directed that notice of said hearing be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspapers of said County; and

WHEREAS, due and legal notice of the hearing on said petition has been given and the Commission has investigated and considered the matter and it being established that the right-of-way to be vacated has not been constructed or used as a right-of-way at any time during the last 40 years:

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Fall River County Commission, the right-of-way described as follows:

dedicated right-of-way (.568 acres, more or less) lying between Tract E in the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter(NE1/4SE1/4NE1/4) of Section 34, Township 7 South, Range 5 East of the Black Hills Meridian, Fall River County, South Dakota, as shown in Book XVII of Plats, page 32 and a parcel of land formerly known as Lot 11R of Country View Subdivision located in the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NE1/4NE1/4) of Section 34, Township 7 South, Range 5 East of the Black Hills Meridian, Fall River County, South Dakota as shown on Plat filed in Book XI of Plats, page 5, subject to any easements and right-of-way presently existing for public utility or drainage purposes and that the public interest will be better served by said vacation, subject to petitioners granting a permanent walking access easement to Mick Irwin and his successors in interest.

Such vacation to take effect after the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the second publication of this Resolution unless the action has been appealed according to law.
