The Pledge of Allegiance was given and the meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Abbott, to surplus to junk the State's Attorney's canon printer, #01809; digital recorders #02052 and #1935, and the dell monitor and computer #02051.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve the raise for Caitlin Turner, certified assessor, from \$13.18 to \$15.18, effective March 21, 2019, as per union contract.

No YouTube comments were reported.

John McBride, Andersen Engineers, met with the board. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the following resolution:

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to table the issue of Mental Health Facilities and a Qualified Mental Health Professional Qualifications until the next meeting.

Andrea Powers, Director of the Southern Hills Economic Corporation (SHEDCO), met with the board to provide a list and map of eligible places in the City of Edgemont for the Bulldoze, Build and Beautify Community Development Block Grant. Discussion was held on the commissioners going on a field trip to see the homes that would be available for the grant. Allen and Falkenburg will meet with Powers.

Break was taken at 9:46 a.m. and the meeting reconvened at 9:55 a.m.

Public comment was heard from Lyle Rudloff, asking questions on where the county was at concerning the BBB grant and a short discussion was held. Falkenburg noted that the county supports the grant project, but research was still being done on expenses, etc. before action is taken.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the board. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve the March 2019 fuel used or work performed to reimburse the highway department as follows: Sheriff's Department for \$2,610.30; Building for \$39.56; Emergency Management for \$80.37; Director of Equalization for \$80.24; GIS for \$35.48; and Veteran's Service Officer for \$13.22.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to approve the application for permit to occupy county highway right-of-way located from intersection of Badger Clark Road and Evans Street to intersection of Badger Clark Road and US Highway 18.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Nabholz, to approve the 2019 Agreement between the State of SD, Dept of Transportation and Fall River County to provide for the Striping and Continuing Maintenance of County Roads within Fall River County, and authorize the Chairman to sign.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Abbott, to approve hiring Cassie Nelson as a Heavy Equipment Operator at \$15.05 per hour, effective April 15, 2019, as per union contract.

Seiler advised that the county has been approved for the Big Grant (Bridge Improvement) for Argentine Township and discussed the condition of the county roads.

Lyle Jensen, Building Supervisor, met with the board. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen to approve the State Supply quote for the Hoffman receiver DT0420 for the boiler, in the amount of \$2,060.71.

Discussion was held on the Garon quote for the courthouse steps. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Abbott, to take no action at this time and have Jensen bring back a quote for full repair of steps in the future.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve the telecommunications right-of-

way Easement for the Fall River County Museum for Golden West Telecommunication's fiber optic installation 10 feet in width, lying east of and bordering the establish right-of-way of North Chicago Street through property in said lots on (1), two(2), three (3), four (4) and five (5), Block 20, of the Original Town, now City, of Hot Springs, Fall River County, South Dakota.

Discussion was held on the courthouse elevator and recent repairs, as well as a possible location for a Prairie Hills Transit bus barn.

Lisa White Face, US Marshal Service, met with the board to give a presentation and discussion on the US Marshal Service using the Fall River County Jail. The county could negotiate fees for this service and White Face recommended the county include transportation and mental health costs in this fee. Grants may be available to expand the current jail for more housing possibilities.

Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Nabholz, to enter into executive session, personnel as per SDCL 1-25-2(1) to conduct the Annual Conference of Commissioners and Director or Equalization as per SDCL 10-3-14, at 10:46 a.m.

Meeting resumed at 11:07 a.m.

Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to adjourn at 11:08 a.m.
