The auditor presented a petition for formation of a new road district, which has been reviewed by the State's Attorney. Motion made by Abbott, seconded by Allen, to accept the petition and set election date for proposed Sonrise North Road District on September 10, 2019.

Brian Ahrendt, State's Attorney, met with the board. Nabholz stated that he had written a letter to the judge, but as of the meeting date had heard nothing back. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to table the conceal carry policy until a later date.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Management, met with the board. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG).

Maynard informed the board that the CRMCS system has been updated with all the Fire and Ambulance equipment information, except for the City of Hot Springs. Personnel is now being worked on. Cards will be printed and here soon. There is a seat plane in Valentine, NE and Casper, WY. One could be moved closer if needed. The board encouraged Maynard to keep working on getting one at the Hot Springs Airport. Maynard also updated the board on 17 fires and incidents.

Bob Evans, Sheriff, was unable to meet with the board. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Allen, to approve hiring Kevin Jennison, jailer, \$12.50 per hour, effective August 13, 2019, as per union contract.

Patrick Ginsbach, Attorney, met with the board and presented a petition to vacate. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Abbott, to set a hearing on October 1, 2019, to vacate the section line right-of-way for Robert McCarthy.

Joe Messino, Town of Oelrichs, met with the board to discuss the commissioner's decision approving tax exempt status for the Bible Holiness Church. State's Attorney Ahrendt will send a letter to the Town that will include a timeline for the consolidated board of equalization, including approval of tax-exempt properties. The letter will also include the South Dakota Codified Laws that address qualifications for tax exempt organizations.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the first reading of dynamic brake devices. Discussion was held including that this is a reasonable ordinance, while leaving the ability to explain the use of such brakes if needed and discussed the authority of the placement of signs (border of county or in specific locations). The second reading will be on the September 3rd agenda.

Jackie Waldner, Nurse, met with the board. Discussion was held on her quarterly report. Clientele has increased and the nurse's office is gearing up for school screenings and flu shots.

Donna Behrens, Coroner, met with the board. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Abbott,

to approve travel for Behrens and Elizabeth Rakness, Deputy Coroner, to attend the Annual Coroner training in Sioux Falls, October 7, 2019 and October 8, 2019 in Sioux Falls.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the board. Motion made by Nabholz, seconded by Russell, to approve hiring Jonathan Lovett, temporary mowing position, \$12.05 per hour, effective July 18, 2019.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Abbott, to accept the low and only bid from Nelson's Oil & Gas for 8,000 gallons of unleaded, at \$2.1685 per gallons, for a total of \$17,348.00.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Abbott, to approve the July 2019 fuel used or work performed to reimburse the highway department as follows: Sheriff's Department for \$2,711.93; Weed for \$656.01; Emergency Management for \$88.06; Director of Equalization for \$18.05; State's Attorney for \$17.77; and VSO for \$11.74.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Nabholz, to correct Marleau Moran's hiring wage (August 6, 2019 meeting) from \$12.50 per hour to \$12.05 per hour, as per the union contract.

Seiler updated the board about replacing the bridge with an 8'culvert on the Edgemont Road. Brosz Engineering is working on a 404 permit for the Ardmore Bridge, along with work needed on the detour for that bridge. Discussion was held on the Dewey Bridge and that Tom Mertz, Louiseau, could be down after Labor Day to start work on OLD Hwy 79 to start on the 4 existing miles of asphalt. The board would like to see the Base One used within this project. More gravel is needed on that project. Seiler will continue to patch this year by Oral and in Oelrichs. Seiler also advised the state wanted to go with a 20 foot width on the Chilson Bridge, which he said no, to continue with 26 feet minimum, to allow for hay and cattle trucks.

Nabholz noted that he requested a presentation from LTAP (SD DOT) for guidance on graveling versus asphalt roads; and reported on calls he had received.



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

FALL RIVER COUNTY ORDINANCE #2019-01

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF DYNAMIC BRAKE DEVICES

- A. Except as provided in this section, the use or operation of a dynamic braking device on unmuffled vehicles is hereby prohibited within Fall River County.
- B. A dynamic braking device is a device used on vehicles that converts the engine from an internal combustion engine to an air compressor for the purpose of braking without the use of wheel brakes. These devices are commonly referred to as "air brakes," "engine brakes," "compression brakes," "Jacob's Brakes," or "Jake Brakes."
- C. This section shall not apply to emergency vehicles, whether or not responding to an emergency.
- D. As an affirmative defense to a charge of a violating of this section, the driver of the vehicle must prove by a preponderance of the evidence that:
 - 1. The driver of the vehicle was operating the vehicle in compliance with all applicable laws at the time the unmuffled dynamic braking device was used; and
 - 2. The speed of vehicle was reasonable given all of the relevant circumstances; and
 - 3. The driver believed that the use of the unmuffled dynamic braking device was necessary to either:
 - a. Avoid an imminent threat to the safety of the driver or any other person; or
 - b. Avoid an imminent threat to property.
 - 4. The driver's belief as to the necessity for using the unmuffled dynamic braking device was objectively reasonable.
 - 5. Violation of this ordinance shall incur a fine of \$250.00 for the first violation and \$500 fine for each subsequent violation.

- **b.** That the <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall be solely responsible for the cost of installation, maintenance, repair and replacement of said pipeline without contribution on the part of the County.
- **c.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u>shall use the pipeline solely for the benefit of the real property identified in the above Paragraph "I". And such other real property belonging to <u>Grantee(s)</u> that is contiguous thereto.
- **d.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall not be entitled to use this easement for any other purpose not provided for herein.
- **e.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall be solely responsible for securing and maintaining any and all permits, licenses or other agreements with the State of South Dakota or any other governmental agency with respect to the construction, maintenance, repair and replacement of said pipeline.
- f. 
