## <u>10-25-41</u>. Reconveyance to record owner of real property held by county under tax deed-Consideration required.

The county commissioners may authorize a reconveyance by quitclaim deed to the record owner or the record owner's assignees or successors only of any real property held by the county under tax deed only. The reconveyance shall be for consideration not less than the total principal, interest, and costs of all taxes represented in the tax deed and any other taxes and interest which are unpaid on the real property.

# <u>10-25-43</u>. Resolution of county commissioners for reconveyance to record owner--Quitclaim deed.

Reconveyance pursuant to § 10-25-41 may be authorized only by resolution of the county commissioners published in the minutes, and the reconveyance may be made only after the time for an appeal from the resolution has expired. The reconveyance is made by quitclaim deed substantially in the form provided by chapter 43-25 and may be made only on payment in cash of the price fixed by the resolution of the county commissioners. The quitclaim deed is executed by the treasurer and attested by the county auditor under seal. The quitclaim deed has the effect only of releasing the title and claim that the county and the taxing districts represented by the county have under the tax deed and any of the taxes that are paid as a part of the price fixed by the county commissioners.



Black Hills Regional Multiple Use Coalition Minutes
September 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020

Meeting at Three-Forks, at 2pm September 25<sup>th</sup>, the BHRMUC hosted a field trip with the Black Hills National Forest to discuss a variety of issues raised by allotment owner Matt Kammerer. The BHRMUC greatly appreciates the time committed by the BHNF to hear concerns from the Coalition. Although the stops on the field trip were all on one allotment, the issues serve as a proxy for what others are seeing across the BHNF. The issues centered around:


- OHV travel through a sensitive riparian area and how to best protect these resources.
- How to contain unauthorized trail development
- Prescribed burning objectives and post-burn remediation.
- Damage to fences caused by negligent OHV travel.

The field trip was well-attended with approximately 25 present. While at Three-Forks, Wudtke provided an overview of the planned stops and that he believes that OHV use, itself, is not the issue as much as the "bad apples" who are operating their machines in an irresponsible manner.

Discussion at each stop was constructive, with folks voicing their frustration without throwing stones directly at the FS. All attendees expressed appreciation for the FS attending the field trip and the efforts from the FS related to the field trip stops. Highlights from the conversations include:

- Fewer Trail Rangers on the BHNF this year and training to issue citations was canceled due to COVID.
- Higher number of trail permits issued this year (roughly 30,000 if my memory serves me)
- Little to no desire from the FS to gate or otherwise block roads that are closed to travel but are seeing traffic sometimes heavy traffic. Lack of desire centered around costs and maintenance program for gates and closures.
  - o This topic was discussed extensively at the first stop where a sensitive riparian area had been damaged by negligent OHV use, along a road which dead ended and was closed to travel but was seeing extensive use.
  - o This was discussed again t the second stop, where an unauthorized trail has been created.
- Kammerer expressed frustration that after handing over the information from catching the OHV users in the riparian area and spring, the FS was unable to issue any citations.
  - o Much discussion about the need for enforcement on the BHNF, from trail rangers and law enforcement. It has to hurt to get "these users" attention.
- Broad agreement was found between the allotment owner and the BHNF that followup prescribed burns would make sense in the area of the third stop.
  - o Kammerer expressed concerns about deadfall timber from pine beetle mortality and reduced access by cattle and horse use.
  - o BHNF agreed that although fire control road should have been remediated following the previous Rx burn, it could be left open while looking into a follow-up burn.

The field trip adjourned shortly after 4:30 back at Three-Forks.
