The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Cope, to approve the minutes for August 5, 2021.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to surplus to sell a green file cabinet, #01839, Treasurer's Office.

The board received notification from the Empower Coalition on a raffle to raise funds for the Toys for Kids program by Poker Run on 8-21-21.

Frank Maynard met with the board to report that the Rapid City National Weather Service's radar has been damaged and will be down for approximately two weeks. The 2022 L.E.M.P.G. agreement has been sent out and will need to be signed and returned to South Dakota OEM by September 30, 2021 if the county agrees to participate.

Maynard informed the Board that applications have been completed for the annual awards for Safety Benefits conference in November, and the preliminary paperwork is being worked on for the Fall River County Annual Exercise. He also spoke on the challenges facing fire departments as more people are building homes in rural Fall River County. Maynard reported on receiving \$16,849.35 for the L.E.M.P.G. reimbursement, and fires and incidents.

Susie Hayes, Director of Equalization, met with the board. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve hiring for James 'Cody' Johnson, administrative assistant, \$13.00

per hour; Cody Romey, administrative assistant (uncertified assessor) \$13.00 per hour; and Lillian Heidebrink, administrative assistant (uncertified assessor), \$13.00 per hour, all effective August 9, 2021, as per union contract.

Discussion was held on continued sales and tax increases.

Commissioner Cope updated the board about the first Ag Land Value Committee meeting on August 30, 2021 at 3:00 p.m. and presented that agenda.

Lance Russell, State's Attorney, met with the Board to review the revised Ordinance 2021-01, and the Board's responsibilities. This includes determining the number of cannabis dispensary establishments, the fee (recommended by the State to set fee at \$5,000.00), the hours of operation for the dispensary, and the setback/separation distances from specific uses. The board agreed to authorize 1 dispensary, set the fee at \$5,000.00, set hours of operation from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and for a 1,000-foot setback/separation from specific uses.

Russell discussed the Application for isolated tract easement by Debra Irene Alexiou-Fleming and Harry Fleming, as per SDCL 31-22-3. He asked Greg Erlandson (the attorney representing the petitioners) to visit the location with himself and Highway Superintendent Seiler before any action is taken.

State's Attorney Russell updated the board on the issue of the tax deed properties that were deeded to the City of Edgemont, noting that an Attorney General opinion issued in 1985 requires that those properties be for public use. The City has asked Russell to request an AG opinion to determine if private ownership is described as public use. The issue will be put on hold until the AG opinion is received.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve setting a special meeting on August 31, 2021 at 9 a.m. for the first reading of the revised Ordinance 2021 - 01, with a special meeting on September 7, 2021 at 9:00 for the second reading, both on medical cannabis.

The Hearing for Off-Sale Liquor License, Forney's Standard Service, Oelrichs, SD, was held as advertised. Motion made by Cope, seconded by Allen, to approve the application for the Off-Sale Liquor License, Forney's Standard Service, in Oelrichs, SD. With Russell abstaining, all others voting yes, motion carries.

The Hearing for 2022 PILT Distribution was held as advertised. Representatives from the Edgemont School were present. Commissioner Russell spoke of the money needed to balance the budget, if changes were made to the revenues the county receives, it would result in increased taxes.

Motion made by Greenough to approve giving 75% of PILT monies received to the schools, fire districts and ambulance. Motion dies for lack of a second.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Greenough, to approve giving 50% of PILT monies received to the schools, fire districts and ambulance. With Cope and Greenough voting yes, all

others voting no, motion failed. The auditor requested distribution scenarios they would like to see, which will be brought back to the next meeting.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve tabling a decision on how to distribute the PILT monies until the September 2, 2021 meeting.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the board. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Cope, to approve the July 2021 reimbursement to the highway department for fuel used or work performed as follows: Sheriff's Department for \$2,744.21; Weed and Pest Office for \$1,201.85; Building for \$92.18; Emergency Management for \$161.54; DOE for \$47.15; and Extension for \$22.50 and maintenance for building vehicles in the amount of \$76.44 and Fire for water tanker repairs in the amount of \$904.41. With Greenough voting no, all others voting yes, motion carries.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve the application for permit to occupy county highway right-of-way from an existing vault near 13321 N Angostura Rd. to the property line between 27901 Pillar Rock Circle and 27900 Twin Rock Bend Rd.

Seiler presented the board with a quote from Nelson's Oil and Gas, Inc. to remove and dispose of the oil furnace from the Ardmore shop; the board requested Seiler bring more quotes.

Seiler spoke of KD Construction getting a contract for 25,000 tons of gravel; the bid was supposed to be for 45,000 tons. The difference will need to be rebid. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve requesting sealed bids for 20,000 tons of gravel for Shep's Canyon Road. With Greenough voting no, all others voting yes, by roll call vote, motion carries.

Seiler updated the board that there is a road grader that will need to be replaced in the upcoming year, a full-time person will be hired with a CDL after Labor Day and that mowing will happen after the project at Shep's Canyon Road is done. Discussion was held on jake brake signs and whether to amend the ordinance. The Chairman asked that the road grader purchase be put on the next agenda.







Policies like these aren't just shortsighted because they needlessly attack an industry but they

create ancillary problems for our communities. Moving freight by rail is three times more efficient than trucks and 99.99 percent of hazmat trains reach their final destination without incident. Policy changes that push more freight onto trucks actually increase pollution all while making roads less safe for passenger vehicles. In addition, the freight rail industry is privately owned, operated and maintained which means they cover the cost of their own infrastructure and repair. Pushing more trucks onto local highways only increases the burden on South Dakota taxpayers.

As a result of these issues, the county is requesting you oppose unnecessary policies like these whether they be included in a final infrastructure bill in the coming weeks or in future efforts that would impact the freight rail system. Instead, I would urge you to consider the existing benefits our freight rail system provides our economy and local communities such as efficiently moving freight, helping to lower emissions, creating good paying jobs, and providing transportation options to local businesses when weighing your infrastructure policies.





a. That the <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall for the purpose of inspection, notify Fall River County Water Users District at (605)745-7648 or Fall River County Highway Dept. at (605)745-3137 in Page 1 of 4

advance, before pipe is placed or covered.

- **b.** That the <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall be solely responsible for the cost of installation, maintenance, repair and replacement of said pipeline without contribution on the part of the County.
- **c.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u>shall use the pipeline solely for the benefit of the real property identified in the above Paragraph "I". And such other real property belonging to <u>Grantee(s)</u> that is contiguous thereto.
- **d.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall not be entitled to use this easement for any other purpose not provided for herein.
- **e.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall be solely responsible for securing and maintaining any and all permits, licenses or other agreements with the State of South Dakota or any other governmental agency with respect to the construction, maintenance, repair and replacement of said pipeline.
- f. That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall indemnify and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, causes of action or damages which may be alleged or have occurred or been causes result of the <u>Grantee(s)</u>'s use of this easement, the pipeline or the negligence of the <u>Grantee(s)</u>, their agents or employees with respect thereto.
- **g.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall maintain, repair, and replace, construct, install and place the pipeline in such a manner so as not to interfere with the use of the real property by the County or its successors and assigns.
- **h.** That <u>Grantee(s)</u> agrees that with any disturbance of the ground during repair, placement, replacement or otherwise that thereafter <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall restore the ground to its natural terrain and in the same condition as the existing roadway at the completion of any such activity.
- i. That <u>Grantee(s)</u> agrees to bury the pipeline in the earth at least seven (7) feet deep and shall erect a sign at the location of the roadway marking the location of the pipeline with a steel post and steel sign identifying the existence of the pipeline and that installing the pipeline the parties understand and agree that the easement is for one and a quarter(1 ½) inch pipeline which shall be sheltered in a two (2) inch casement. <u>Grantee(s)</u> also agree(s) that if the pipeline is to cross a County road that is paved that the above conditions apply except that the <u>Grantee(s)</u> agree(s) to bore under said road to install said pipeline.
- j. That <u>Grantee(s)</u> shall have the right of ingress and egress upon County's real estate herein contemplated for purposes of constructing, repairing, maintaining and replacing said pipeline in order to keep it serviceable and in a useable condition. That said



PIERRE, S.D. – Today, the Legislature's Interim Rules Review Committee approved the Department of Health's proposed administrative rules to establish a medical cannabis program in South Dakota. The legislature approved 143 of 149 proposed rules.

Following the legislature's endorsement of the rules, Governor Kristi Noem and Secretary of Health Kim Malsam-Rysdon released the following statements:

"We are on track to implement a responsible medical cannabis program in South Dakota according to the direction given by the voters," said **Governor Noem**. "I commend the Department of Health for its hard work to streamline the process. South Dakota will continue to implement the best, most patient-focused medical cannabis program in the country."

"The passage of today's proposed rules package by the committee is the result of months of work. It's proof that the public engagement process works," said Kim Malsam-Rysdon, Secretary of Health. "I am disappointed the rules review committee chose to take out the list of specific medical conditions for qualifying medical cannabis patients, a list the Department promulgated based on public input."
