Flex Work Schedule Protocol Director of Equalization Office August 5, 2021

As per the Union Contract, *Article 5, Work Week, Overtime, Payday, Clerical Employees*, the DOE office is requesting the following Flex Schedule Protocol to be adopted for its employees.

Purpose: to create a more productive workflow, with the most efficient use of our time, and to accommodate those situations where we are required to work outside of the normal 8:00am – 5:00pm schedule.

Flex Time Situations:

- 1. When working in the field **15 or more miles** outside of Hot Springs City limits, the DOE employees may take a 30-minute lunch break.
- 2. When required to attend after hours meetings or classes, the DOE employees may extend the workday hours as needed. (ex: City Council meetings or Local Board Meetings)
- 3. When working in Oglala Lakota County, the DOE employees may extend the workday hours to be anywhere from 6:00am 8:00pm.
- 4. When training new staff members, it is beneficial to work outside of the 8 5 window in order to have some uninterrupted one-on-one time with the Director.

When any of these situations occur where the employee has worked more than 8 hours in a day, the employee may flex time on another day within that same week, as long as they keep the total hours worked at 40 per week. OR, the employee may choose to work their regular hours in addition to the extended hours and use this as overtime, with supervisor approval.

ARTICLE 5

Work Week, Overtime, Payday, Clerical Employees

Section 1. Eight (8) hours between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., with one (1) hour for lunch, will constitute a day's work. Five (5) days, from Monday morning at 8:00 a.m. to Friday night at 5:00 p.m., will constitute a week's work. However, by mutual agreement between the Department Head and the Employee with the approval of the County Commissioners a flex schedule may be used to work outside the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Section 2. All hours in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of one and one-half (1 1/2) times the hourly rate as set forth in the classification contained herein. When overtime is to be worked, the employee must secure permission from their Supervisor, or the said employee will not be compensated for such time worked.

Section 3. Work performed on Sunday will be paid for at the rate of two (2) times the existing hourly rate for that employee. Work performed on Holidays will be paid at the rate of two and one half (2 1/2) times the existing hourly rate for that employee for those hours worked.

Section 4. A fifteen (15) minute break shall be allowed in the morning and in the afternoon. These break times will be staggered so as not to interrupt work. The usual time for such break times will be midway in the morning shift and midway in the afternoon shift. This break cannot be used in conjunction with other types of leave time.





The above Typical Road Section and Typical Approach Detail (below) shall be followed in the construction of roads to be placed on the County Road System. Road design shall be consistent with published Standards of the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials. Road construction materials and methods shall conform to the current published edition the "Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges" of the South Dakota Department of Transportation, when referenced in the Standards below. Copy of these Specifications is on file at the County Highway Department Office.

The following are standards which shall be met:

- 1. Maximum Grade of any road or portion of road shall not exceed ten percent (10%)

- 5. Gravel Surfacing shall meet the requirements of Part B of the Standard Specifications.
- 6. Asphalt and Concrete construction methods and materials shall meet the requirements of Part C and Part D of the "Standard Specifications".
- 7. All Dead-End Roads shall have Cul-De-Sacs with a minimum constructed radius of fifty feet (50').
- 8. Approaches shall be constructed perpendicular as practical to the County Road.
- 9. The Minimum dedicated Right-Of-Way width shall be sixty six feet (66').





Fall River County Commission:

On behalf of the South Dakota Game Fish & Parks, I want to thank you for your coordination and administration of the recent road improvement project on approximately 5.5 miles of Fall River County Road 71A from SD Hwy71 to the Shep's Canyon Recreation Area boat ramp parking lot. Our local staff have confirmed completion of the project to satisfaction according to our agreement (#2021-27-1). Please see our agreement amendment to increase the amount of funding for final billing of the project. Signature of the amendment will be necessary prior to the state issuing final reimbursement costs for the project.

While we do have some concern about the narrower top surface, lack of road shoulder, and irregular shoulder drop-offs, we understand these may have been unintended consequences of the road improvement project. The department is optimistic these improvements will provide a quality and safe road surface for our recreational users and those private property owners that utilize this portion of road for many years. The amount of traffic on this road will very likely continue to see additional usage putting even more pressure on providing a safe and quality surface. GF&P continues to encourage the county to provide scope of work, cost estimates, and cost-share requests in writing for future major road surface improvement projects. Ongoing maintenance to maintain the safety and quality of the existing surface will be the responsibility of the county according to our agreement #2021-27-1.

Again, we would like to thank the county commission and county highway superintendent for their ongoing efforts to maintain a high-quality surface on this section of road. If you have any further questions, please contact our local parks staff office at Angostura Recreation Area or the parks planning department in the Pierre office.

AMENDMENT to AGREEMENT

#2021-27-1

This AMENDMENT modifies AGREEMENT #2021-27-1 that was entered into by the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks (SDGFP) and Fall River County, South Dakota (COUNTY) in order to facilitate a PROJECT for the application of asphalt millings, gravel and "Base One" stabilizer to Fall River County Road 71A (5.5 miles) leading to Sheps Canyon Recreation Area in 2021.

WHEREAS, because the final total cost of the PROJECT has exceeded the estimated cost of the original AGREEMENT, it has become necessary to amend that AGREEMENT.

NOW THEREFORE, SDGFP and COUNTY hereby agree that the AGREEMENT between the parties is modified and amended as follows:

- 1. The total "Not to Exceed" amount of \$250,000 for SDGFP's 50% portion of the PROJECT be increased to \$275,000.
- 2. Except as modified by this AMENDMENT, all terms and conditions set forth in the original AGREEMENT #2021-27-1, made and entered into by and between the parties hereto shall continue to remain in full force and affect.

This AGREEMENT is binding upon the signatories hereto not as individuals but solely in their capacities as officials of their respective organizations and acknowledges proper action of SDGFP and COUNTY to enter into it.

DRAFT BILL 50

GRASSLAND TAX RELIEF BILL

Question:

What would you do if you got a notice that your taxes were going up 60% to 280%?

That is exactly what our Ranchers, both East and West River could be facing if the new soil reassessment that currently is on hold, were to be implemented.

Issues with the new soil reassessment:

- The new soil reassessment that was just pulled back by the Department of Revenue was generated in conjunction with Dr. Elliott from SDSU. This survey, using artificial intelligence, reclassified land from Grassland to Cropland.
- The new study did not take into consideration rainfall or elevation when re-classifying the soil tables.
- There are 43 million acres of agricultural land in South Dakota. Even though county assessors have the authority to physically walk the land and make adjustments in soil types, it would be virtually impossible to physically walk millions of acres of land and make the thousands of adjustments necessary.

Solution: Draft Bill 50

We are introducing Draft Bill 50 which states that, "In addition to the categorization of agricultural land pursuant to § 10-6-130, 5 agricultural land may also be categorized as noncropland, regardless of the soil 6 classification of the land, if the elevation of the land is greater than one thousand nine 7 hundred and fifty feet above sea level, it has been seeded to perennial vegetation for at 8 least twenty years and used for animal grazing or left unharvested, or if the agricultural 9 land is native grassland."

According to the County Assessor from Fall River County, Draft Bill 50 would correct 85% of the problems facing our ranchers.

Testimonial Rancher #1: Examples of their new soil reassessment

Parcel #945: Cropland shown is 57.79 acres of 146, arranged in patches between narrow, rock-covered slopes difficult for modern equipment to negotiate; used as grazing land.

Parcel # 9576: Section 32: no cropland, too rocky and sloped.

Parcel #1120, #944: Crop acreage indicated as 63.8 of 237 acres. The acreage is located in irregular patches/ strips, widely separated and are not contiguous and unsuitable for crops.

Parcel #1116: Acreage indicated as suitable for crops is 4.67 acres of a total of 80; two tiny patches, separated by the entire width of the parcel.

Testimonial Rancher #2: A third generation moved back to SD Family Ranch

The proposed tax is completely unsustainable for any family ranch. The suggested tax would take the family rancher out of the equation leaving big industry to come in. The ranching way of life is dying and this proposed tax would definitely kill it completely. The shake of hand doing business, helping during branding season, the sense of community that comes with ranching would be gone as well.

- 10 An owner of agricultural land may request the director to categorize the land as

- 13 promulgated by the department pursuant to chapter 1-26. If the director determines that
- 14 the land meets the criteria provided by this section, the director shall assess the land as
- 15 noncropland and use the noncropland productivity dollars for the following assessment of
- 16 property on November first.
- 17 Section 2. That chapter 10-6 be amended with a NEW SECTION:
- 18 Any person who requested that land be categorized as noncropland pursuant to
- 19 section 1 of this Act and changes the use of the land to cropland or another use shall notify
- 20 the director by August first.
- 21 For land categorized as noncropland as a result of misrepresentation of the use of
- 22 the land or because of a failure to provide notice of a change of use under this section,
- 23 the director shall assess a penalty equal to the difference in the tax amounts that would
- 24 have been assessed if the land were classified as cropland over the four prior tax years.

Black Hills Regional Multiple Use Coalition- September 24, 2021

The September 2021 BHRMUC meeting was called to order at 4:08 pm at the Holiday Inn in Spearfish, SD on 09/24/2021. Those in attendance were Eric Jennings, Don Hausle, Ben Wudtke, Jean Kennedy, Dale Kennedy, Larry Mann, and Matt Lottes.

Larry asks to amend the meeting agenda to start with discussion about the status of the Jenny Gulch Gold Exploration Project. Eric moved to approve amendment, Jean Kennedy seconded, and all were in favor.

Eric passed out copies of the Treasurer's Report. Matt motioned to approve the report, Don seconded, all were in favor.

Larry spoke on F3 Gold's struggles to move forward with the Jenny Gulch Gold Exploration Project. While exploration projects of USFS usually receive a Categorical Exclusion, an Environmental Analysis (EA) is being conducted for this project. The draft EA can be found at https://www.fs.usdsa.gov/project/?project=57428. Larry noted that the General Mining Act of 1872 provides for a right to mining exploration on federal public lands. The project projects to use 42 50'x50' drill pads totaling approximately 2.4 acres all together. 3" diameter cores are drilled to extract mineral samples. The cores are filled and capped in reclamation. Larry asked that the group would submit comments to the Forest Service on the project. Eric moved to develop and submit comments, Matt seconded, and all were in favor.

August field trip recap (Kirk Hill Fire south of Sturgis) – Ben summarized that while the hot, dry, and windy conditions created high fire danger, the stand conditions of the forest resulted in a low intensity fire that was similar to that of a prescribed burn. The fire had burned through a recently commercially thinned stand of timber. Ben also summarized the issue with mistyped structural stage classes of USFS stands.

Black Hills Timber – The GTR is looking like it will be used by the USFS as the "best available science" in the decision making process regarding the future of the Black Hills timber sale program. Ben informed that the Data Quality Act may be used in litigation by the BHFRA against the Forest Service to challenge the GTR if it is used to reduce the timber sale program. All in attendance at this meeting were in favor of the BHRMUC supporting the BHFRA in this. Precommercial needs will likely not be met with the reduction of timber sales due to reduced KV funds.

Ben discussed the need for the Forest to get back to traditional forestry (treat areas that need to be treated) as opposed to the current BHRL project mainly focusing on treating one type of stand and ignoring others.

Elk Management Plan – Eric discussed his main concern with the project: not enough contingency tags made available. 20 contingency tags were given out this year to further control the elk population during this excessively dry year.

OHV progress – basically the Forest Service has been having meetings to plan for more meetings. It was noted that 80% of ATV activity takes place on road systems (not trail systems). Revenue from ATV permits just goes towards trail system maintenance not road system maintenance, so there is a dilemma on how to address ATV damage/disturbance to roads. Following a brief round-robin, the meeting adjourned at 6:14 pm.
