FALL RIVER COUNTY UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF DECEMBER 1, 2022

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on December 1, 2022. Present: Joe Allen, Les Cope, Joe Falkenburg, Heath Greenough, Deb Russell and Sue Ganje, Auditor.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the agenda with the addition of a resolution for the Variance for Medical Cannabis Cultivation.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve a pay raise for Charles Dobbs (Certified Deputy), \$17.50 to \$19.50 per hour, effective November 21, 2022, as per union contract.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve setting a supplement and contingency hearing for December 15, 2022 at 9:30 a.m.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve setting a year end meeting for December 29, 2022 at 9 a.m.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Allen, to table the \$1,500 essential pay until executive session.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve the minutes of November 17, 2022.

There were no applicants for county assistance.

Teresa Pullen, Treasurer, met with the Board. Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Allen, to approve hiring Misty Heronimus, \$14.00 per hour, effective November 28, 2022, as per union contract.

Stacey Martin, GIS, met with the Board. Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Allen, to approve the Vanguard quote for online mapping, with a one-time fee of \$1,000.00 and a yearly fee of \$2,681.25, for 5 years, as long as Oglala Lakota County also signs the 5 year offer and agrees to pay their portion.

A Hearing continuation for the Variance for Medical Cannabis Cultivation License was held. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Cope, to accept State's Attorney Russell's recommendation that 1) the application was denied after evidence presented that no sign was placed 10 days before the hearing and 2) that the application failed burden of proof on the Variance C 1-4 and the Ordinance B 1-5 and A 3.

With all voting yes, by roll call vote, motion carried.

Joe Falkenburg, Commissioner, discussed with the Board the possibility of hiring a Public Defender versus continuing with the current Court Appointed Attorneys. Discussion was also held stating that the State's Attorney's office has helped to keep the costs down for the fees and collection of fees. Reimbursements were discussed. Concerns were raised about the small size of the county and having to hire conflict attorneys to assist. Hustead Law Office would be in touch with the State's Attorney's Office to work out concerns and details; further discussion would be held at the next meeting.

Calvin and Cole Romey met with the Board to request maintenance on South Beef Creek Road as it is listed on the SD DOT mapping as a Secondary Road. Discussion was held regarding what services the County provides on minimum maintenance roads. State's Attorney Russell provided a prior SD Attorney General's opinion on the subject.

Motion made by Greenough, to approve having the Romeys purchase all of the needed gravel, with the County putting ballast down first and having the County haul the gravel and maintaining. Motion dies for lack of a second.

State's Attorney Russell recommended to the Board that they take the matter under advisement and to table the discussion until the next meeting so he and Attorney Romey could work on an agreement.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, reported to the Board that a rancher is requesting a pipeline easement; the Board advised Seiler if he's comfortable with it, go ahead and proceed with the easement and get firm approval at the next meeting. Commissioner Russell spoke of the need for gravel in areas of the Oral Road.

Sheriff Evans reported 10 males and 4 females are being held in the Fall River County Jail, with 2 males and 1 female in the Pennington County Jail, for a total of 17 inmates; further discussion was held on rates being raised at the Pennington County Jail in January. Additional comments were heard from Paul Nabholz, Kim Allen and Dusty Pence with continued concerns about the 2022 General Election. Allen also spoke of research that has been done involving Cannabis processing; she has concerns regarding taxes, water and pesticide use and the carbon footprint. Commissioner Falkenburg spoke of the government no longer being able to control weeds in the Big Horn area of Wyoming, which could affect our county in the future.

Sue Ganje, Auditor, gave a report to the Board on the issue of the 3 precincts that had received 1 to 3 packets of Oglala Lakota County ballots that were mistakenly wrapped and marked as Fall River County ballots, along with their proper Fall River County ballots. The incorrect ballots were opened first in those precincts and they contacted our office. We then contacted precincts in both counties to make sure there were no other ballots that were in the incorrect county, which there were not. The Oglala Lakota County ballots that had been voted in Oelrichs were then considered spoiled ballots. The precinct sealed the ballot box and the Auditor's office staff transported it, along with the remaining incorrect ballots to secure in our vault. At that time, correct ballots and a new ballot box were delivered. The 10 original voters were contacted and asked to come back to the Oelrichs poll to vote on Fall River Ballots, 9 of which returned. Hot Springs #2 had 7 voters and Jackson had 9 voters that were given the incorrect ballots. They immediately located the bundles of correct ballots for use. Those Oglala Lakota County voted ballots remained in the ballot boxes. Going forward, the office is creating a 2-person verification system before the final seal is applied to wrapped ballots, and/or any other election items are sent to the polls. This will be for ballots, totes with precinct specific supplies and other items, as needed. The Oglala Lakota ballots ran thru the tabulator successfully with the Fall River Ballots, counting all the similar races on both county's ballots. ES&S (our ballot printing company) stated that both county ballots were coded Sequence 00001 and both were printed by style, so it did not differentiate between counties.

Ganje reported on a letter from Disability Rights of SD which noted concern on the doors handles and step at the polling place in Oelrichs. Discussion was held on ways to fix those items to increase accessibility to the Community Center. Commissioners Greenough and Cope spoke of the handicap entrance in the back. If that is not sufficient, the polling place could be moved to the new gym at the school.

Ganje also discussed that growth for pay 2023 was incorrect due to the current software conversion to a new vendor, and growth not being entered into the IBM system that converted the tax file to the auditor. Discussion was held on the county and entities that requested the maximum taxes allowable by the revised growth factor. Ganje will bring the item back to the next meeting.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Greenough, to enter into executive session as per SDCL 1-25-2 (1) for personnel purposes and as per SDCL 1-25-2 (4) for negotiations at 10:49 a.m.

The meeting resumed at 1:18 p.m.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Allen, to approve \$1,500.00 in essential pay for all employees.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to adjourn at 1:20 p.m.



State of South Dakota Official Opinion No. 95-01 February 23, 1995

County maintenance of highways and roads

*1 Curtis D. Mortenson Stanley County State's Attorney Post Office Box 190 Fort Pierre, South Dakota 57532

Dear Mr. Mortenson:

You have requested an opinion from this Office concerning county maintenance of highways and roads. Your inquiry cites the following facts:

FACTS:

Stanley County is updating its County Highway System. This revision may add substantial miles of roads which have been maintained by the county for more than twenty years. These roads are frequently located on private property and are situated both on and off section lines. In many instances, they lead from an existing county highway serving the public, to a home or farm building, and may best be described as long driveways. The county highway revision may also include little used roads which lead to isolated tracts of land.

Based upon the above facts, you have asked the following questions:

QUESTIONS:

- 1. Does SDCL 31-3-1 allow the county to treat private driveways as public highways or part of the county highway system, due to the county's expenditure of public funds for their upkeep during the past twenty or more years?
- 2. Are section-line highways as defined in SDCL 31-18-1, equivalent to the "secondary roads" mentioned in SDCL 31-12-26?
- 3. What level of maintenance is the county obligated to provide for "secondary roads" mentioned in SDCL 31-12-26?
- 4. May a county provide varying levels of maintenance for section-line highways?
- 5. May a county designate portions of the county highway system or county secondary highways and roads, as "minimum maintenance," allowing a road to be maintained without gravel or more than annual grading?
- 6. Do the county's obligations under SDCL 31-28-6 apply only to public highways which are part of the county highway system, and not to secondary highways and roads not included in the county highway system?

IN RE QUESTION NO. 1:

County commissioners may not convert private driveways into public highways under SDCL 31-3-1 even though these roads have been maintained with public funds for the past twenty or more years.

SDCL 31-3-1 states in pertinent part as follows:

Whenever any road shall have been used, worked, and kept in repair as a public highway continuously for twenty years, the same shall be deemed to have been legally located or dedicated to the public, and shall be and remain a public highway until changed or vacated in some manner provided by law....

(Emphasis added). "Highway," defined at SDCL 31-1-1, specifically excludes roadways or driveways upon land owned by private persons. This Office has previously opined regarding this definition, confirming that a private driveway cannot be part of a designated county highway system, and public funds should therefore not be expended on its construction or maintenance. See 1953-54 A.G.R. 51 and 389, 1959-60 A.G.R. 368, 1967-69 A.G.R. 207.

*2 As a result, a private roadway or driveway is not a "public highway" subject to SDCL 31-3-1, despite county maintenance for twenty years. Furthermore, a private roadway or driveway is not used as a public highway as required by this statute, and SDCL 31-3-1 would not apply.

A county therefore may not treat a private roadway as a public highway, include it in the county highway system, or expend public funds for its maintenance.

IN RE QUESTION NO. 2:

A section-line highway is not equivalent to a "secondary road" mentioned in SDCL 31-12-26. This statute states: It shall be the duty of the board of county commissioners and county superintendent of highways in organized counties, to construct, repair, and maintain all secondary roads within the counties not included in any city, incorporated town, or organized civil township.

(Emphasis added).

A section-line highway is defined at SDCL 31-18-1 as follows:

There is along every section line in this state a public highway located by operation of law, except where some portion of the highway along such section line has been heretofore vacated or relocated by the lawful action of some authorized public officer, board, or tribunal.

This statute does not define section-line highways as secondary roads. The Supreme Court has characterized this statute as an acceptance of the United State's grant of rights-of-way for highway construction over public land. See Gustafson v. Gem Township, 58 S.D. 308, 235 N.W. 712 (1931); Costain v. Turner County, 72 S.D. 427, 36 N.W. 382 (1949). It essentially means that section-lines must remain accessible to public travel unless vacated or relocated by a governing body. See also State v. Peters, 334 N.W.2d 217 (S.D. 1983) (improved section-lines open to public hunting).

The definition of "highway" in SDCL 31-1-1 is very broad and includes "[e]very way or place of whatever nature open to the public, as a matter of right, for purposes of vehicular travel...." Therefore, the use of "secondary roads" in SDCL 31-12-26 is synonymous with "secondary highways," defined at SDCL 31-1-5(4) as follows:

(4) "County secondary highways," the rural local highways in organized counties, excluding the approved county highway system, that are under the supervision of a board of county commissioners.

According to this definition, a county must assume supervision over the construction and maintenance of a road before it is deemed a "secondary highway." See 1963-64 A.G.R. 233, A.G.O. 81-33 and 84-02. While a section-line highway is required to be kept open to the public pursuant to SDCL 31-18-1, it is not a county secondary road/highway unless a county has assumed supervision over it.

IN RE QUESTION NO. 3:

No clear standard has been established by statute or the courts concerning the level of maintenance which a county must provide to secondary roads/highways. SDCL 31-12-26 provides:

It shall be the duty of the board of county commissioners and county superintendent of highways in organized counties, to construct, repair, and maintain all secondary roads within the counties not included in any city, incorporated town, or organized civil township.

*3 This statute does not set out a specific standard of road maintenance.

The Supreme Court has addressed the obligation of counties to maintain roads in the county highway system pursuant to SDCL 31-12-19. Bryant v. Butte County, 457 N.W.2d 467, 469-470 (S.D. 1990). SDCL 31-12-19 requires county commissioners to "maintain properly and adequately the county highway system ... on all or different portions of the same as the board of county commissioners may deem most expedient...." The Court found the mandatory language of this statute imposes a ministerial obligation on a county to maintain roads in the county highway system. Id. at 470.

The minimum standard for this maintenance was recently discussed in Bland v. Davison County, 507 N.W.2d 80 (S.D. 1993). In addressing the duty to perform snow and ice removal on county roads which are part of the county highway system, the Court noted that "negligence occurs when one fails to exercise that care which an ordinarily prudent or reasonable person would exercise under the same or similar circumstances, commensurate with existing and surrounding hazards." Id. at 81. The Court found the obligation of SDCL 31-12-19 to "maintain properly and adequately the county highway system" requires counties to exercise "reasonable and ordinary care" to preserve the highways in a "reasonably safe condition." Id. at 82.

The Court has not, however, specifically ruled on the minimum standard of maintenance required to be performed on county secondary roads/highways. In Bryant, the Court referred in dicta to the mandatory language of SDCL 31-12-26, characterizing it as imposing a ministerial duty on counties to maintain and repair county secondary roads/highways. However, because both Bryant and Bland actually involved roads which were part of the county highway system, a definitive minimum standard of maintenance required to be performed on secondary roads has not been established.¹

IN RE QUESTION NO. 4:

A county does have some discretion to provide varying levels of maintenance to section-line highways. If a section-line highway has been designated as part of the county highway system, the commissioners must comply with the minimum standards set out in SDCL §§ 31-12-19 and the Bryant and Bland decisions. If the county has assumed supervision over section-line highways so that they are deemed secondary roads/highways, the county has a general duty to maintain them under SDCL 32-12-26. However, no clear minimum standard for this maintenance has been established.²

If a section-line highway is neither part of the county highway system nor a county secondary road/highway, the county has no duty to maintain it. It is entirely within the discretion of the county to perform any improvements upon section-line highways. See 1963-64 A.G.R. 233; A.G.O. 89-17 and 93-01.

IN RE QUESTION NO. 5:

County commissioners do not have statutory authority to designate any road as "minimum maintenance." There is a specific statute that allows a township board to designate a road as "minimum maintenance" and to maintain it at "less than the minimum standards" (SDCL 31-13-1.1), but there is no corresponding statute authorizing such action by a county.

*4 Along with this absence of statutory authority, the Supreme Court held in Bland and Bryant that a county has a mandatory duty to maintain roads which are part of the county highway system in a "reasonably safe condition" to comply with the "adequate and proper" language of SDCL 31-12-19.

Furthermore, counties lack express statutory authority to designate a county secondary road/highway as "minimum maintenance." However, as discussed above, there has not yet been a definitive ruling on the minimum standard of maintenance required on county secondary roads. It is possible that this minimum standard may be less than that required on roads which are part of the county highway system, and may include the discretion to declare and post secondary

roads/highways as "minimum maintenance."

Counties will, when allocating available funds, inherently exercise discretion in determining where and to what extent county roads are improved or maintained. See 1963-64 A.G.R. 233; A.G.O. 89-17 and 93-01. Whether an annual grading trip is sufficient to meet the standard set out in Bryant and Bland for roads on the county highway system, or what minimum standard of maintenance a court would require on county secondary roads/highways, will depend on the circumstances of each case.

IN RE QUESTION NO. 6:

The duties placed upon county commissioners by SDCL 31-28-6 apply to all roads for which a county is responsible. SDCL 31-28-6 requires all public boards or officers "whose duty it is to repair or maintain any public highway," to erect and maintain warning signs concerning points of danger on the highway. This statute appears to apply to all roads which a county must maintain by statute, and to all roads over which a county has assumed responsibility pursuant to SDCL chs. 31-3 and 31-12. Accordingly, a county's duty under SDCL 31-28-6 encompasses county secondary roads/highways, as well as roads in the county highway system.

Footnotes

- Under SDCL 31-12-31, when a proposition is adopted by which the county agrees to maintain all secondary roads in the several townships (organized or unorganized) of the county, the county has the same powers and authority regarding the construction and maintenance of secondary roads as it does for roads on the county highway system. It has not yet been resolved whether this "power and authority" equates with a duty to provide the minimum level of maintenance required under Bryant and Bland.
- There are some duties which are specifically imposed by statute of which the county should be cognizant. See, e.g., SDCL § 31-32-6, 31-32-9, 31-32-10.





The above Typical Road Section and Typical Approach Detail (below) shall be followed in the construction of roads to be placed on the County Road System. Road design shall be consistent with published Standards of the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials. Road construction materials and methods shall conform to the current published edition the "Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges" of the South Dakota Department of Transportation, when referenced in the Standards below. Copy of these Specifications is on file at the County Highway Department Office.

The following are standards which shall be met:

- 1. Maximum Grade of any road or portion of road shall not exceed ten percent (10%)
- Maximum Degree of Curvature shall not exceed twenty one degrees (21 degrees)
- Crown rates shall be between 0.02 11/11 to 0.06 11/11. Maximum Super elevation rate in curves shall be 0.07 11/11.
- Culverts shall be sized to assure proper drainage. The minimum size of culvert shall be eighteen inches (18") in diameter. Although fifteen inch (15") diameter will be allowed under certain conditions.
- 5. Gravel Surfacing shall meet the requirements of Part B of the Standard Specifications.
- 6. Asphalt and Concrete construction methods and materials shall meet the requirements of Part C and Part D of the "Standard Specifications".
- 7. All Dead-End Roads shall have Cul-De-Sacs with a minimum constructed radius of fifty feet (50').
- 8. Approaches shall be constructed perpendicular as practical to the County Road.
- 9. The Minimum dedicated Right-Of-Way width shall be sixty six feet (66').



I. PAYMENT ALLOCATION DETERMINATION

This Notice is an official communication from the Directing Administrator of the National Opioid Settlements. A copy of this Notice has been sent to the Enforcement Committee and Settling Distributors pursuant to Section IV.B of the Distributor Settlement Agreement, dated as of July 21, 2021, as amended, between and among the Settling States, the Settling Distributors, and Participating Subdivisions (the "Distributor Settlement Agreement"). All capitalized terms used in this letter have the meanings ascribed to them in the Distributor Settlement Agreement.

Pursuant to Section IV.B and Exhibit M of the Distributor Settlement Agreement, South Dakota's Total Payment Year 2 amount is \$1,807,559.46, which is broken down in Table 1 in Attachment 1 to this Allocation Notice.

As provided under Section V.C of the Distributor Settlement Agreement, South Dakota has instructed the Directing Administrator to calculate the intrastate allocations pursuant to a State-Subdivision Agreement ("South Dakota Opioid Settlement Memorandum of Agreement"). Section II.A. of the State-Subdivision Agreement states that "all Opioid Funds will be divided proportionally with 70% allocated to the State (Statewide Share) and 30% allocated to the Participating Local Governments (Localized Share) pursuant to SDCL 34-20B-116." The Agreement further states that the "Localized Share will be allocated to the Participating Local Governments in the proportions set out in Exhibit B, attached hereto, ... which is based upon the opioid negotiation class model developed in connection with In re: Nat'l Prescription Opiate Litigation, MDL 2804 (N.D. Ohio)." The Agreement further states that "if a county or city listed on Exhibit B does not join this MOU, then that non-Participating Local Government's allocation of the Localized Share...will be reallocated to the Statewide Share." Section IV.A. of the Agreement indicates that the "Statewide Share will be distributed to the opioid abatement and remediation fund" and the "Localized Share will be distributed directly to each Participating Local Government." The intrastate allocations are included as Attachment 1 to this Allocation Notice.

Undisputed amounts allocated to the Statewide Share and Localized Share for Participating Subdivisions will be paid no later than the date that is 50 days after the date of this Allocation Notice.

II. YOUR RIGHT TO DISPUTE

Section IV.B.4 of the Distributor Settlement Agreement provides that within twenty-one (21) calendar days of receiving notice any party may dispute the calculation of the amount to be received by a Settling State or its Participating Subdivisions listed on Exhibit G as inconsistent with the terms of the Agreement. Written notice must be provided to the Settlement Fund Administrator, the Enforcement Committee, any affected Settling State, and the Settling Distributors identifying the nature of the dispute, the amount of money that is disputed, and the Settling State(s) affected.

A party has until the Deadline to Dispute Allocation listed at the top of this Allocation Notice to deliver a written notification of dispute. The amounts listed in this Allocation Notice will be deemed accepted if the Directing Administrator has not received a party's dispute before midnight Eastern Time on the deadline date. Submit your written request by email to DirectingAdministrator@NationalOpioidOfficialSettlement.com.



Any party affected by the dispute may object to the notification of dispute. Depending on the nature of the dispute, contested disputes must be resolved in either the court that entered a state's Consent Judgment or the National Arbitration Panel. The Directing Administrator will not disburse any funds potentially affected by a contested dispute until the dispute is resolved by the court or the National Arbitration Panel.

III. TO ACCEPT PAYMENT

If you do not dispute the payment and you have previously created a Portal Account and completed your Payment Election Forms and W-9 Forms, no further action is needed. The Directing Administrator will begin issuing payments after the applicable deadlines have passed using the existing payment instructions. If you have not previously created a Portal Account, please do so and complete the Payment Election Forms and W-9 Forms to create payment instructions for any Settlement Payments. Keep your payment instructions current in the Portal as the Directing Administrator will use these forms to issue settlement payments.

IV. TO REALLOCATE PAYMENT

If you wish to reallocate your portion of the allocation to another Participating Subdivision or the State Fund, you may notify the Directing Administrator of your intent to do so using the Direct Payment and Allocation Election screen on the Portal before the Deadline to Dispute Allocation included on the Allocation Notice. The Directing Administrator will not treat a reallocation request as a dispute.
