### FALL RIVER COUNTY UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF OCTOBER 5, 2023

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on October 5, 2023. Present: Les Cope, Joe Falkenburg, Heath Greenough, Deb Russell and Sue Ganje, Auditor. Absent: Joe Allen

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. The full context of the meeting can be found on the county website under Commissioners at http://fallriver.sdcounties.org, or on Facebook, on the Fall River County's website.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Russell, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve the minutes of the County Commissioners for September 21, 2023.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Cope, to approve the Auditor's Account with the Treasurer for August, 2023.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to set a Supplement and Contingency Hearing on October 19, 2023 at 9:30 am.

There were no County Assistance applications.

Lyle Norton, Sheriff, met with the Board with updates including the following jail count: 20 inmates, 15 male and 4 females with 1 additional male being held in Pennington County.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve purchasing two 2024 Dodge Durango vehicles off of State Bid, at a total cost of \$86,722.00. The amount does not include upfitting the vehicles with law enforcement equipment.

Norton noted that the County received money from a 50/50 Grant awarded for the purchase of Bullet Proof Vests in the amount of \$2,789.55.

Chief Deputy Belt gave a report to the Board on the free Use of Force Instructor Training in Pierre, September 18-28, 2023 that he had attended. Room and board and most meals were paid for by LET. All law enforcement officers are required to have this training every 2 years. He can now provide the training to other Deputies and possibly other local law enforcement.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Manager, met with the Board. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve the Chairman to sign the 4th Quarter LEMPG single signature sheet.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve the Chairman to sign the appointment of Gary Baker, Assistant Emergency Manager, as applicant agent regarding FEMA documents.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve the Chairman to sign the designation of Gary Baker, Assistant Emergency Manager, as applicant agent regarding FEMA documents.

Maynard informed the Board that the SD DOT has created a new policy to allow individual counties to close County Roads and include them in the 511 System if there is a weather emergency. Maynard provided a quote for the UPS Battery System for backup. Melissa Fleming, Lead Dispatcher, was present to give a summation of recent power outages and how they effected the 911 Dispatch operations, including how the county was non-compliant with SD State regulations during the outages.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to accept the quote for the UPS Battery System for Dispatch from Rushmore Communications in the amount of \$46,277.74 and proceed with the purchase.

Greenough asked for the status of the radio repeater for the Oelrichs area and for a map of the coverage areas. Maynard stated that the County needs to consider the Eckert well location for the repeater as he has had no interest by an electrician to work on that project at the water tower, there will be need for trenching, and there is no building. The Eckert well has electricity and a building. Maynard will provide a map of the coverage area.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board to provide updates regarding current projects. The culvert for County Road 79C on the East side of Angostura Reservoir will arrive soon and installation will begin next week. He reported that he had spoken to Doug Kinniburgh, SDDOT Engineering Supervisor, regarding the Igloo area and was told that they are still working on negotiations for the contract with Simons for right of way. Seiler also noted that his department is currently doing the 2<sup>nd</sup> mowing of the roads for the season and have about 2 weeks of mowing left. The Commissioners spoke of the Hwy 385 road construction that is occurring in Hot Springs and are concerned with access to the Courthouse. The Commissioners requested that Seiler invite Rich Zacher, DOT Area Engineer, to attend the next meeting to provide answers. Greenough spoke of the North Butte Road and needed maintenance.

The Fall River County Master Transportation 2024-2028 5-Year Highway and Bridge Improvement Plan Hearing took place at 9:30 am, as advertised. Seiler noted that there were no changes from last year. It was noted that the bridge near Oelrichs is on the Plan as an eligible project, but Seiler doesn't intend to replace it. He feels that a culvert will be sufficient and less expense for that site. Seiler also noted that, if the cost of chip sealing continues to rise, they may split the asphalt projects into 2 two years rather than all in 2025. Motion made by Cope, seconded by Russell, to approve the Fall River County Master Transportation 2024-2028 5-year Highway and Bridge Improvement Plan.

Amy Ferley, Edgemont School Superintendent, presented information regarding the Heavy Equipment simulators that they received as part of a 50/50 Grant and invited the Commissioner's to stop in for a demonstration. She believes that this is a great benefit for the Edgemont students, which the board concurred with.



Comes now, Petitioners, pursuant to SDCL § 31-12A-3, who constitute not less than twenty-five percent of the eligible voters as defined in SDCL § 31-12A-1.2 who own land lying within the limits of the territory proposed to be organized into a road district and file this Petition with the Fall River Board of County Commissioners asking that a road district be organized to function in the territory described herein.

This Petition is filed with the Fall River County Auditor and shall be presented to the Fall River Board of County Commissioners for consideration at its next meeting.

This Petition conforms with the requirements of SDCL § 6-16-2 and sets forth the following:

(1) The proposed name of the road district is the "Woodland Rd Road District".

  - a. the Fall River Board of County Commissioners define the boundaries for the Woodland Rd Road District;
  - b. that a referendum be held within the territory so defined on the question of the creation of a road district in the territory; and
  - c. that the board determine that such a district be created.

Petitioners attach and incorporate here as Exhibits "A", "B" and "C" pursuant to SDCL § 31-12A-2, plats and map of Pine Haven Subdivision which are an accurate survey and map of the territory intended to be embraced within the limits of the road district, showing the boundaries and area of the Woodland Rd Road District, which has been verified by the affidavit of the surveyor, and filed with the Fall River County Register of







I am pleased to be writing this letter of support on behalf of the Fall River County Hwy Dept for the Edgemont School District's desire to help continue providing and enhancing opportunities for High School students by purchasing Heavy Equipment Simulators for the CTE program.

Fall River County contain large numbers of farm and ranches being over 1,000 of acres. Fall River County population is 7,258 which contains 22.80% under the age of 18. Having a high percentage of residents under the age of 18 creates the need for getting those that we can provided training and safety of heavy equipment to carry farm and ranching opportunities. Needing to know how to operate heavy equipment is beneficial to maintaining and keeping up the farm and ranch daily tasks. Heavy equipment is needed to handle difficult tasks and unpredictable terrain, which also makes them a great asset on a farm.

Heavy equipment can maneuver the land efficiently, carry items such as livestock feed, and much more. A front-end loader can handle a range of tasks. It can be used to move loose material (such as manure or soil), lift heavy items, create ditches, and even grade the land. Dozers are used heavily in large- and small-scale construction, road building, mining's and quarrying on farms. A farm needs a decent motor grader to help maintain the gravel roads that allow you to get around your land. In remote areas, farm roads can quickly become impassable, following extreme weather events. Fall River County is known to have extreme weather due to much of the county lying in what is known as a banana belt. Graders are very versatile and can also be used for cleaning ditches, building terraces, and levelling the ground in preparation for new structures to be built.

Fall River County does not have a lot of Job Opportunities so being able to provide this training would be beneficial to sticking to the family roots and taking over the family ranch. This is a way of life around this area. Having the skills needed to operate Heavy Equipment would prove beneficial for carrying out the family traditions of farming and ranching in the community and would put these students one step ahead in the farming and ranching industry.

I commend Edgemont School Districts vision to develop a program implementing a high-quality construction program to immerse their students into.



### Farmers and ranchers taking their property rights into their own hands as South Dakotans First

The property rights coalition is backed by South Dakota Farmers Union, Dakota Rural Action and Landowners for Eminent Domain Reform

SIOUX FALLS, S.D. — Farmers and ranchers in South Dakota are coming together to advocate for their right to private property under a new coalition: South Dakotans First.

The organization cited a survey they conducted of 1,037 South Dakota voters, and found that over 80% of that sample oppose eminent domain being used for use by private companies like Summit Carbon Solutions.


South Dakota Farmers Union is one of the main backers of the organization, and the its president, Doug Sombke, said the effort represented by South Dakotans First tracks with those of his organization.

"I think the most important thing is that we have to find a way to get the legislators to agree, both in the Senate and the House, that we want to make personal property rights a thing that is best for the property owner, not necessarily a private company that wants to become rich from the tax dollar," Sombke said.

Dakota Rural Action and Landowners for Eminent Domain Reform are the two other organizations besides SDFU behind the coalition,

its stated goal being "no private company should be able to rob South Dakota landowners of their property rights."

An organic farmer, a former Lake County commissioner and a member of Dakota Rural Action, Aaron Johnson said he was fortunate enough that the landowner he leases from has denied a request my a pipeline company to plant a pipeline on the land he and his family farm and live on.

The goal of the organization isn't just to push state lawmakers, but also local governments.

Johnson said he has faced resistance from the Lake County Commission to establishing an ordinance to restrict the placement of hazardous transmission pipelines on private property in the county.

That resistance, he said, is frustrating.

"They're so quiet about their situation. The staff there has not provided much information to the public, and they don't want to have public meetings to discuss ordinances," Johnson said. "I just think that's the responsibility of our elected officials."

Minnehaha and Moody counties established ordinances that would limit the ability for private companies to place pipelines transmitting hazardous chemicals through county land. Both counties defended their ordinances during the Public Utilities Commission hearing for Navigator CO2 Ventures' pipeline project application, an application that was ultimately denied by the commission.

Sombke said a group of landowners called him with concerns about the land recently approved for purchase in Lincoln County for the new prison. While Sombke did not specify what South Dakotans First's position was on the land purchase, he said he was looking forward to working face to face with farmers and ranchers to address the unique property rights challenges they are facing.

"I mean, when are they going to get it that farmers and ranchers and these communities that they're affecting don't give a d--- about the money?" Sombke said. "That's not the point. The point is we want them to listen to us and respect us, period."

Sombke called on those present to ask their representatives to prioritize legislation that respects individual landowner property rights come next session. Reps. Jon Hansen from Dell Rapids, Karla Lems from Canton, John Sjaarda from Valley Springs and Chris Karr from Sioux Falls were present.

The legislature has been planning for the new women's prison and the new men's prison for the past few years, Hansen said, and the speed and lack of transparency with which those decisions are just now being made are a concern.

"I've been voting against those appropriations because I didn't know where the thing was going to go, and I felt like there needed to be a little more transparency about where it was going to be and who it was going to affect," Hansen said of the purchasing of land in Lincoln County for the men's prison.

Legislation, introduced by Lems and sponsored by Hansen, Sjaarda and Karr, among others, that would have decategorized carbon dioxide pipelines as common carriers was killed in the South Dakota Senate after passing through the House last March.

No members of the South Dakota State Senate were present at the event.

Dear Fall River County Commissioners, Joe, Les, Joe, Heath and Deb:

First, I'd like to thank you for doing the work you do on behalf of the county residents. It can't be easy.

In lieu of attending a meeting, I am sending this letter with photos to apprise you about "developments" that are going on in the county. Little pieces of land are havens for those who want housing but do not want to abide by the laws. Although there are state laws against what they are doing—not having septic systems—it is apparent that no one is enforcing the laws. Here is a problem that is going on in the unincorporated town of Oral, right next to Sand Creek, where a group of trailer houses have been accumulating over the past five years.

From Stacey Martin, FRC GIS, "Tara Ghost requested an address on May 29th 2018. The assessor reviewed the site and recorded the mobile home there on December 6th, 2018. (At least they recorded their notes on Dec 6th.)" That trailer is at 116 First Street, which is the main street through town. In other words, the county knows about the trailers.

CHAPTER 74:53:01, INDIVIDUAL AND SMALL ON-SITE WASTEWATER SYSTEMS 74:53:01:12. Wastewater not allowed to surface on ground or enter state waters

After a year of no septic system being installed, in December 2019 I filled out a confidential complaint form with the DANR, and included photos. After a few months, I contacted them again and was told that someone from DANR had gone to the property and no one was at home. From what DANR told me, that was all they did.

Besides the creek flowing near to the trailers, the area has also flooded. The last time was June 4, 2015. (See photo). Although this photo doesn't show it clearly, a good deal of flood waters spilled onto the land where the trailers now sit. Stacey Martin, FRC GIS, shows that these lots are in the flood plain.

In September 2022 while I was in Pierre for a meeting, I went and talked to DANR about the trailers in Oral as well as a couple of other concerns. While there, I called Stacey Martin and handed the phone to DANR so they could talk directly to her about land ownership.

In February 2023, I received a copy of a letter that DANR sent to other individuals advising me that the other concerns I had, were addressed. Part of that letter reads: "You are responsible for contacting your planning and zoning office to determine if there are any local ordinances or requirements with which you need to comply." But there was nothing about the trailers in Oral in that correspondence.

As you know, Fall River County has no planning and zoning office. The county website does give a great deal of guidance.

Here we are in August 2023 and there are more trailers moved in at 112 First Street, as well as small trailers that have no 911 address. (See photos). There have not been any septic systems installed. The lots are not owned by the trailer owners, but are shown to belong to Christopher Jennings. Who is responsible for installing septic, the land owner or the lessors?

My overall concern is that Fall River County is ripe for more of this and people are walking all over the county. The county relies on state law and the state relies on county zoning—which we don't have.



# A few rules for rural living

ISIWYG, that's old computer talk for what you see is what you get. In practical terms that means if you buy property, the road conditions on the day of your purchase should be expected to remain the same. When you get a house or raw piece of land that is accessed via a gravel road that produces dust, don't expect it to change. With dust you have visibility challenges which means you will need to drive slower when following another vehicle, so you can see. Your auto will be dirty. If your residence is close to the road, dust will filter into the home. Realize this before you sign on the dotted line, and decide if it's something you can live with. If you buy with the attitude that I'll make them black top the road once I move in, you will be in for a rude awakening.

Once you leave the county road system and enter your property, you will be responsible for road maintenance, come snow or mud or potholes. Know your soil. If it's gumbo, you might not be able to get out of your place for a day or more due to severe mud, ditto with snow. You need to be prepared to either hire snow removal (and don't wait until the first snowfall to find a person to provide the service), or buy your own equipment and learn how to run it. Areas with road districts have their own guidelines for maintaining a road.

The most important word that needs to be drilled into your head is RESPONSIBILITY. You wanted to move out from the city or town where services are provided and residents rarely have to think about them. Suddenly, it's an entirely different scenario when you live in the country. If the sewer backs up, it's up to you to hire a company to come and trouble shoot the problem, pump the septic tank or put in a new septic system. It's the same story with water if you have a private well. It is your problem and your dollars that will be needed to rectify the situation. When good internet or cell phone service is important to you, it is up to you to determine, before you build your house, that what is available will suit your needs. Don't take anyone else's word

Become part of the community. Join the fire department, volunteer at the local museum or other worthwhile entity, get involved in a church, and get to know your neighbors. Wave when you meet a vehicle, whether you know the driver or not. It's the neighborly thing to do and if you have city people come to visit, it will baffle them.

Rural life is not the same as you had just in a different geographical location — it is a new start with opportunities. �

The purpose of this letter is to follow-up on the inspection conducted by Neal Konda and Abraham Waldner on March 1, 2023. The inspection was conducted to investigate a complaint indicating the properties do not have appropriate onsite wastewater systems and that any system would be in the floodplain.

During the inspection, the department met with William Smith, who indicated he had installed the systems that were in place to service the properties. Mr. Smith provided information for both installations that included directly piping gray water out of the homes and directing black water to 250-gallon tanks buried adjacent to each trailer. Mr. Smith also indicated that a well was installed near the southwest corner of the west trailer which services both homes. There was no visible riser or wellhead observed and it was indicated that the entire well is below grade. Based on the department's observations and the information provided by Mr. Smith the systems do not meet the minimum requirements of the Administrative Rules of South Dakota (ARSD) 74:53:01.

The department is requiring you to hire a certified installer to replace the current systems. Note that due to the floodplain, it is likely the only system that may be installed in this area will be a holding tank which will require regular maintenance. Any tank will need to be placed such that the tank lid elevation is above the floodplain elevation. Appropriate setbacks to the onsite well must also be met.

By May 1, 2023, the department is requiring you to hire a certified installer to submit plans and specifications to the department for a system to service the trailer homes. Upon approval of plans and specifications by the department you must complete installation within 30 days.

#### Description of Inspection:

In response to a written complaint alleging the properties do not have appropriate onsite wastewater systems and that any system would be in the floodplain of Sand Creek, the department conducted an inspection of the property. Photos from the inspection can be found in Attachment A. An aerial view of the property can be found in Attachment B.

#### **Inspection Findings:**

The department met with Tara Ghost and William Smith at the east trailer (116 First Street). Mr. Smith indicated he would show us the systems that were installed to service the trailers. It was indicated that he had installed the systems and that the systems are separated into black and grey water systems.

For the east trailer, the system consists of a grey water pipe that runs north from the northwest corner of the trailer to the north property line and outlets at the fenceline. No tanks or controls exist for the grey water system. The black water system drains to what is described as a 250-gallon tank off the northwest corner of the trailer. A soft area was observed immediately around the visible tank lid but no free water was observed. It was indicated that this system had been in place for about two years.

Tara Ghost / Christopher Jennings March 1, 2023, Inspection Report For the west trailer, the system consists of a grey water pipe that runs north from the center of the north end of the trailer to within a few feet of the north property line. No tanks or controls exist for the grey water system. The black water system drains to what is described as a 250-gallon tank off the northeast corner of the trailer. A soft area was observed immediately adjacent to the area where the piping becomes buried. A tank lid was not observable. It was indicated that the west system had been in place for approximately three months.

Mr. Smith indicated that an onsite well supplied water to both trailers. It was indicated that the well was located off the southwest corner of the west trailer. No visible wellhead was observed. Mr. Smith indicated the well was completely buried with the pump servicing the trailers just east of the west trailer.

#### In Office Follow Up:

Review of FEMA flood maps show nearly the entire property is in the flood plain of Sand Creek. Only a small portion in the extreme northeast corner of the east lot lies outside of the floodplain. It is unlikely the area is large enough to support an absorption system as it is unlikely that setback distances to the property line and home can be met.

#### Conclusions:

Based on the observations in the field, the systems do not meet the minimum requirements of the Administrative Rules of South Dakota chapter 74:53:01. No part of the systems meet prevailing requirements for tank size, absorption system size, or wastewater component separation distances. Mr. Smith is not a certified installer and should not be installing onsite wastewater systems until such time he is certified.

Information regarding the onsite well has been turned over to the department's water right group for follow up.


#### Requirements:

Based on the inspection findings, the department is requiring the following:


- By May 1, 2023, hire a certified installer to submit plans and specifications to the department.
  Note that due to the site location a limited number of options are available. It is likely that the
  only system that will be approvable will be a holding tank which will necessitate regular
  maintenance.
- Complete installation within 30 days of the department approving plans and specifications for the onsite wastewater system.























Photo 5 - Outlet end of the grey water pipe. It was indicated that the north property line is the white fence.





Photo 7 — Concrete plug lid that was described as the septic tank lid (east trailer).







Photo 11 - Grey water piping from the west trailer.




