Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to make a motion to postpone until the next meeting, authorization for Lance Russell, State's Attorney, to proceed with the eviction action on Laura Sedlacek at the physical address of 406 6th Ave, Edgemont, SD with the legal description of N50' of Lots 1, 2 & 3, Block 9, Stewart's Addition to Edgemont, Fall River, South Dakota. The 3 Day Notice to Quit has been served by Law Enforcement. The Board wants to have Lance Russell, SA present to provide an explanation regarding this agenda item.

There were no County Assistance applications.

Lyle Norton, Sheriff, met with the Board with updates including the following jail count: 23 inmates, 15 male and 4 females with 1 additional male and 3 additional females being held in Pennington County. He gave a reminder to the Board that Elevatus would be here on November 2nd and 3rd, 2023 to talk with them individually regarding the feasibility study.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Manager, met with the Board. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Cope, to approve the purchase of a new desktop computer for Gary Baker, Assistant Emergency Manager, in the amount of approximately \$1,100.00 which he has in his budget, and it is LEPC eligible.

Maynard noted that he had provided maps indicating the proposed Ekert Well Repeater coverage area and the Oelrichs Water Tower Repeater coverage area in the Board's packets, as requested. The maps provided did not clearly show the coverage areas, and the Board asked for better maps. Maynard will reach out for better versions of the maps. Maynard then reported on fires and incidents.

Randy Seiler, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board to present fuel quotes and provide updates.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen to accept the only bid for 8,000 gallons of #2 Diesel from Nelsons Oil & Gas for \$3.70/gallon. Vollan Oil and MG Oil did not provide a bid.

Seiler noted that he had been asked to consider an approach permit from an individual South of Smithwick on Smithwick Road. After further discussion, Russell indicated that they probably shouldn't allow any, due to a previous decision to disallow any more. Sue Ganje, Auditor, will look for the minutes/resolution that reflects that. The Highway Department will be bringing the trucks in to the shop to install the sanders to be ready for potential inclement weather. All the gravel has been hauled from the Solar Farm. The culvert was installed on 79C. They are blading and mowing now. Russell asked that something

be done for the Smithwick Road where it turns from pavement to gravel. Seiler stated that they will be putting some cold mix at the end of the pavement to fill the holes to fix the road.

Joe Falkenburg, Chairman, spoke regarding the eminent domain legislation. County Commissioners from other areas, along with Fall River County, voiced their disagreement regarding use of eminent domain by private entities such as the Carbon Capture Pipeline, or other private entity projects. Falkenburg pointed out that, by getting involved, it helped to keep this from happening.

The Supplement and Contingency Hearing occurred at 9:30 am. Ganje explained the needs and reasons for the supplements and transfers. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve Fall River County Resolution #2023-39 Supplemental Budget 2023, #1 and Contingency Transfer 2023, #1.

Jerry Stearns, Provo Area Water System, met with the Board to request board concurrence on the proposed increase of water rates.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve the new Provo Area Water System water rates as follows: the meter rate is currently \$35.00/month and will raise to \$45.00/month for ag land users and is currently \$30.00/month and will raise to \$40.00/month for residential customers in Igloo and Provo and will include the first 2,000 gallons of water; the current water usage rate is \$2.50/1,000 gallons and will raise to \$3.50/1,000 gallons for ag land users and is \$4.00/1,000 gallons for residential after the first 2,000 gallons.

Shirley Schumacher, local Oral area resident, met with the Board in Peggy Sanders' absence regarding the issues with a few of the residents in Oral to include, but not limited to the lack of septic systems in a flood plain, overcrowding of vehicles, lack of trash services, etc. Deb Russell, Vice-Chairwoman, advised that she had spoken with Lance Russell, State's Attorney. He is working with the State of South Dakota on this matter and will pursue legal action at the appropriate time.

John McBride and Dustin Ross, Andersen Engineers, met with the Board. For the commissioners information, they presented the SD Codified laws that govern platting of lots and land, noting that not approving a plat may result in a lawsuit.

Public comment was heard from Timi Burdette, Oelrichs Town Board President, to address the Board's concerns on a property with an abundance of junk, and of the RV park that is no longer being used for short term RV camping as intended, but for more permanent RV parking. The Board advised Timi Burdette to work with their Town attorney. Highway Superintendent Seiler came back during public

comment to inform the Board that he had spoken with Rich Zacher, SDDOT Area Engineer, who noted that the construction will not get to the Courthouse until next year, but there will be access to the courthouse. The handicapped parking space directly in front of the Courthouse. Seiler also noted that he spoke with Diane Newham regarding the Igloo area roads and that the State had not gotten a signed easement yet, so there is no new information at this time.

Lily Heidebrink, Director of Equalization, met with Board to provide updates. Sam Kipp has completed and passed his Use/Pap, his 5 Self-study workbooks and his Basics school. He is planning to take the Certified Appraiser/Assessor examination the beginning of November. After that he will be a Certified Assessor. She also provided a verbal report on her recent training, which included how to use sales ratios and statistics to better analyze the annual sales data that is used to calculate property values. She learned how other counties do their sales verifications to determine if they are good sales or not.

Lastly, Heidebrink spoke to the Board that she will advertise for a data entry Administrative Assistant instead of a Certified Assessor due to the small number of applicants that have applied for the Assessor job. Then, if interested, they could train to become an Assessor. The Board said that they would support that approach.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to go into executive session at 10:09 am to discuss personnel as per SDCL 1-25-2 (1).

The Board came out of executive session at 10:50 am.

No action was taken on hire approval for an Administrative Assistant for the Extension Department.

Security Assessment Agreement

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between Dakota State University, Madison, South Dakota ("DSU") and Fall River County ("FALL RIVER COUNTY"), a political subdivision of the State of South Dakota, on this 23rd day of October 2023.

WHEREAS, DSU operates Madison Cyber Labs ("MadLabs") which encompasses a variety of educational, research and development items related to cyber activity including identifying security flaws, along with analyzing and detecting cyber threats; and

WHEREAS, Project Boundary Fence is part of MadLabs at DSU; and

WHEREAS, Project Boundary Fence, a free resource for South Dakota county and city governments, seeks to assist county and city governments in securing networks from cyber attacks through external penetration testing on outward facing technology infrastructures; and

WHEREAS, Project Boundary Fence performs cybersecurity assessments in order to identify network vulnerabilities while also validating current security defenses; and

WHEREAS, FALL RIVER COUNTY seeks assistance from DSU in order for DSU, via Project Boundary Fence, to conduct a cybersecurity assessment of FALL RIVER COUNTY systems, networks and facilities ("System") in order to determine whether potential weaknesses exist in said Systems; and

WHEREAS, in order to conduct a cybersecurity assessment of FALL RIVER COUNTY Systems, DSU, via Project Boundary Fence, may seek to bypass security mechanisms in order to attempt to gain access to FALL RIVER COUNTY Systems; and

- 10. DSU hereby assigns to the FALL RIVER COUNTY all right, title, and interest in and to all reports, schedules, models, budgets, and other documents, and all information contained therein, prepared and assembled by DSU in connection with this Agreement.
- 11. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, assignees, and successors of the respective parties.
- 12. The parties agree that electronic transmission via facsimile or email to the other party of a copy of this Agreement bearing such parties' signature shall suffice to bind the party transmitting same to this Agreement in the same manner as if an original signature had been delivered. Without limitation of the foregoing, each party who electronically transmits an executed copy of this Agreement via facsimile or email bearing its signature covenants to deliver the original thereof to the other party as soon as possible thereafter.

Dear Commissioners,

During FY2023, the South Dakota Department of Health's Office of Child and Family Services (OCFS) gave over 10,000 immunizations, cared for 3,634 pregnancy care clients, and provided 894 safe sleep environments. The Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program also served 14,000 clients monthly. This great work was made possible by our strong partnerships with counties like yours across the state that provide staff and space through contractual agreements with the Department of Health (DOH).

OCFS continues to respond to the changing needs of our clients and citizens of South Dakota. In recent years, our clients desired various options for service delivery. We have shifted from only delivering services in-person and via telephone to offering telehealth services through a new platform, where clients can conveniently meet with health professionals in a virtual space. In the next few months, we also plan to roll out mobile units that will deliver a wide range of public health services to rural sites where DOH does not have a physical location. Additionally, we have implemented an electronic health record to improve care coordination, streamline workflows, and monitor population trends.

As we continue to implement new technology and offer additional services, it's important to recognize that quality starts with our dedicated workforce having the training and time to carry out all these activities. The duties and responsibilities of the Community Health staff have grown over the last several years. To balance quality care for clients with the needs of the DOH workforce, we will be creating a distinct separation of our Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program and Community Health Services. Staff will specialize in one area, allowing them to stay current on best practices, policies, and procedures, and carry a consistent case load. We are also implementing additional supervisory support, with five dietitian managers across the state who will supervise the staff and activities of the WIC program. Public Health Nursing Managers will continue to supervise Community Health Services activities such as immunizations, school health services, and the pregnancy care program.

As we enact these changes beginning September 1st, 2023, we will continue to monitor the needs of each county through data, and staff and client feedback. We will assess any gaps with the new service delivery model and ensure South Dakotans continue to have access to all the programs offered by OCFS.

In the next week, you will receive your FY24 WIC contract. As you review it, please pay special attention to section #3 Scope of Work and Performance Provisions. We have also included updated documents outlining the duties of the WIC Clerical and Public Health Assistant positions. Please reach out if you have questions. We look forward to our continued partnership to improve the health and well-being for families across the state.



LUMMIS LEADS EFFORT IN INTRODUCING THE PROTECTING THE RIGHT TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS ACT

October 6th, 2023

U.S. Sen. Cynthia Lummis (R-WY) joined Sen. Mike Braun (R-IN) and 19 of her colleagues in introducing the Protecting the Right to Keep and Bear Arms Act, which would prevent the President and the Secretary of Health and Human Services from declaring a public health emergency to impose gun control.

The bill would serve as a firewall to protect the Second Amendment rights of people in Wyoming from the anti-gun activists in the Biden administration.

Earlier this month, the governor of New Mexico instituted a public health emergency for the purposes of suspending the Second Amendment-protected carrying of firearms.

This week, President Biden announced an Office of Gun Violence Prevention which is set to be led by multiple left-wing activists who have previously worked for pro-gun control groups, including the Community Justice Action Fund, an organization dedicated to declaring a national gun violence public health emergency as one of its three policy planks.

The Protecting the Right to Protect and Bear Arms Act prohibits the President or their designee, from declaring an emergency pursuant to the National Emergencies Act or major disaster pursuant to the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act in order to impose gun control.

The act also prevents the Secretary of Health and Human Services from declaring public health emergency pursuant to the Public Health Service Act for the purpose of imposing gun control and prevents any government official from prohibiting the manufacture, sale or transfer of a firearm or ammunition during a disaster or emergency.

Thanks for your inquiry about the intersection of U.S. Highway 18 and S.D. Highway 79, east of Hot Springs, commonly known as Maverick Junction.

The SDDOT conducts regular reviews of our highways and intersections to ensure that we stay acquainted with highway safety and traffic volume concerns at those locations. Occasionally we will conduct a more focused review, called a safety audit, at specific locations. Conducting a safety audit means that we assemble a team of highway and safety professionals to review crash history, highway and intersection design, road conditions, and safety. As part of that audit, recommendations are made. The recommendations can vary from doing nothing to full reconstruction of the intersection, and everything in between. As a result of this inquiry, we will conduct a Safety Audit for this intersection in the coming months. To-date, we have stayed apprised of crash concerns there and have made improvements at the intersection to address some of them. A recent improvement is covered in a bit more detail below.

Of the crashes at this location, we have already taken steps to eliminate the most prevalent crash type, accounting for almost one-quarter of the crashes in the last 10 years. Those crashes would occur when southbound motorists were slowing to turn right during slick conditions, and would then slide through their turn, crashing into eastbound motorists waiting to enter the intersection. To address those crashes, we installed a high friction surface, consisting of epoxy covered with fine rock on the road surface. The additional friction created by this surface greatly reduces the chance of motorists sliding as they slow to turn. Since making that improvement five years ago, that type of crash has been eliminated. The dark pavement on the image below is the location of the high friction surface treatment.

We are writing to bring your attention to the Maverick Junction intersection: Hwys 79 and 385/18. State statistics show that there have been 39 crashes in a ten year period. Because of the speed are vehicles going north and south, accidents here can be deadly. Even without an accident occurring, citizens of Fall River believe the intersection to be difficult to navigate safely. Specifically, it is dangerous to enter north or south from Hot Springs/Fall River Road. Entry to go North and South has view blocked with oncoming traffic. It becomes a blind entry.

We met recently and several suggestions have been made. Please see attached map.

- Peel off/exit lane with turning ramp on the NW (traveling from Rapid City to Hot Springs)
- and separate entry/merge lane for the SW corners (traveling from Hot Springs toward Nebraska).
- · Lower grade on these lanes so that cars trying to enter N & S can actually see the traffic coming.
- · Separate them from the main highway.
- · Start the turn lane southbound at the top of the hill on 79 to turn into Hot Springs.
- Close the Coffee Cup entrance at the intersection.
- Traffic will enter Coffee Cup by means of the north or south entrances to the service road.
- · Fix the service road and widen entries to allow access. Pave, widen, ramp.
- · Lower speed at intersection to 45mph.

We would appreciate your consideration in making this intersection safe for all traveling. It is a large intersection and it takes a great deal of time to get clear and up to speed. It also is nearly impossible for fast moving vehicles to slow and avoid an accident when someone cuts out in front of them. This is even more pronounced with motor homes and semi trucks.

Please let us know what thoughts, ideas, and solutions you have.
