Jeanine Lecy, County resident, spoke regarding the research that she has done with comparisons of other counties regarding a Jail/Justice Center. Susan Henderson, County resident, expressed that she did not agree with building a new Jail/Justice Center. Joe Allen, Commissioner, informed the Board that the American Legion is agreeable to a lease to place a large American flag on the Museum grounds. The Board would like Allen to go over a draft of a lease with State's Attorney Russell.

Allen then provided a brief update regarding the proposed Jail/Justice Center. He is still working on the logistics of the flood plain.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the Intergovernmental Contract and Coverage Document for SDML Workers' Compensation Fund.

The payments to entities for omitted mill levies for 2023, pay 2024 was then discussed.

Motion made by Greenough, to approve paying the Oelrichs School Special Education \$132,896.52; Eagle Valley Road District \$7,105.00; and Hot Brook Road District \$5,896.00 for the omitted levies. Motion died for lack of a second.

State's Attorney Russell spoke with the Board regarding the denial to pay from the insurance company. He also presented an Attorney General's opinion saying that it can't just be paid out of the General Fund and requested that the attorneys for the other entities contact him for further discussion.

Official Canvass for the 2024 General Election was conducted. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the Official 2024 General Election Canvass.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Greenough, to enter into Executive Session as per SDCL 1-25-2 (1) personnel and SDCL 1-25-2 (3) legal at 11:27 a.m.

Falkenburg declared the Board out of Executive Session at 12:25 p.m.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Greenough, to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the Law Enforcement Agreement between Fall River County and the City of Edgemont.

Falkenburg declared the meeting adjourned at 12:40 p.m.

Whereas, Maynard began his journey with Fall River County in the year 2002, but has worked in government for many years prior to that;


Whereas, Maynard has devoted his time to promoting the welfare of the County, emergency mitigation practices and holding the position that he served to higher standards;



If legal loads are desired, consider removing the asphalt overlay. This structure was not designed to support the additional weight of the asphalt. This would also involve tapering back the asphalt approaches to smooth transition onto the bridge. The better and preferred long-term option would be to replace the timber cap in the North half of the West abutment. This timber cap is not capable of carrying legal loads and is also severely decayed at the North end. The South half of the West abutment and the entire North abutment are constructed of an HP 12 x 53, which can carry legal loads. (Note: Starting in 2023, the SDDOT load rating manual mandated that all abutment caps need to have a load rating analysis performed. 





Typical Decay of Piles at Waterline - Bents 4 and 5










Split in G3 in Span 9



Extensive rehabilitation would not be cost effective on this 92-year-old bridge. If legal loads are desired the structure would require replacement.

To aid in prolonging the life of this structure consider sealing the concrete in the deck with a silane or similar type product and avoid using deicing chemicals on the bridge. Could also clean and paint the beam ends.

At time of inspection the approach pavement at the bridge ends caused severe bumps onto the structure. Consideration should be given to milling of the asphalt to smoothen the transition onto the bridge.



Spalling with Exposed Rebar - Beam 5 over Abutment







Beginning in 2023, it was required by SDDOT that all bent/pier and abutment caps be analyzed for load rating capacity. Therefore, this is the first inspection cycle in which the abutment caps were analyzed on this structure. Upon analysis it was discovered that the timber cap portion of the west abutment on this structure cannot support legal loads.


The north end of this 12"x12" timber cap is decayed up to 5" deep at the NW corner.

Our analysis indicates that a load limit posting of SU 28; Comb. 40 is required.

This load rating could be increased by replacement of the timber portion of the west abutment cap. It is also recommended that removal of the asphalt overlay will improve load carrying capacity and increase the service life of the prestressed concrete tee beams.




Configuration of West Abutment Cap

PERFORMANCE CONTRACT BETWEEN FALL RIVER COUNTY

AND

BLACK HILLS COUNCIL OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

FOR THE

FALL RIVER COUNTY NATURAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN UPDATE

PARTIES:

The parties to this agreement are the BLACK HILLS COUNCIL OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, a public agency created under the *Joint Powers Act of the State of South Dakota*, hereinafter called the COUNCIL, and FALL RIVER COUNTY, hereinafter called the COUNTY.

PURPOSE:

The COUNTY is proposing to update the Fall River County Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan, which will expire in August 2025. The COUNTY, after full consideration of all the various FEMA requirements related to local mitigation planning, has concluded that outside technical assistance is necessary to complete the Plan update.

CONSULTANT EMPLOYMENT:

The COUNTY has determined that the COUNCIL has the necessary staff expertise and resources to satisfactorily undertake the plan update. Due to the level of administrative and technical effort required to complete the plan update, the technical support provided by the COUNCIL is outside the customary level of service associated with annual membership dues. Therefore, the COUNTY hereby engages the contractual services of the COUNCIL to perform all administrative and technical tasks related to this project. The COUNCIL agrees, pursuant to orders, advice and direction of the COUNTY, to fulfill its responsibilities as assigned by this contract.

TERMS OF CONTRACT:

This agreement shall commence upon its execution by both parties and shall terminate upon the adoption of the Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. In the event of termination, the COUNCIL shall be compensated pro rata for the percentage of Responsibilities performed prior to the date of termination.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

The parties to this contract agree to the following responsibilities.

The COUNTY agrees to:

- provide compensation to the COUNCIL in accordance with the terms of this contract;
- provide information and guidance to the COUNCIL staff during the contract period;
- fully consider and take appropriate actions recommended by COUNCIL staff regarding specific administrative procedures;
- assume responsibility for all advertising and legal publications related to public meetings, public review, and adoption of the plan;
- assist in defining and engaging stakeholders during the plan update;
- assist in coordinating space for public meetings related to the plan; and,
- establish a suitable media platform and/or local site accessible to the public to review the Plan.

The COUNCIL agrees to:

- coordinate the planning process;
- collect all relevant data in order to complete the Plan Update;
- maintain documentation of the in-kind match as required by the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, awarded to the COUNTY for this project;
- identify risks, vulnerabilities, mitigation strategies, and plan maintenance actions;
- write the Plan Update in a manner that meets the standards defined by FEMA; and,
- provide an electronic copy of the plan and adoption resolution to the COUNTY to complete the Plan Update.

COMPENSATION:

The COUNTY hereby agrees to provide compensation to the COUNCIL in the amount of \$10,500 for services rendered in the development of the Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan Update as outlined in this contract. The compensation shall be paid through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Award received by the COUNTY in October 2024. COUNTY will be invoiced \$5,250 (50% of contract) after the first draft of the mitigation plan has been sent to the County for review. COUNTY will be invoiced the remaining \$5.250 (50% of contract) after the updated plan has received APA (approvable pending adoption) status from FEMA.

The COUNCIL shall submit to the COUNTY an invoice for services rendered. The COUNTY agrees to pay the COUNCIL within 60 days of receipt of billing. Any balance not paid within 60 days of the billing date shall accrue interest from the billing date at the rate of nine percent per annum.

HOLD HARMLESS

To the fullest extent permitted by law, each party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other party, including each other's agents, employees and volunteers from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the party's respective Responsibilities as set forth herein, including loss of use resulting therefrom and which is caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of the party, or any subcontractor of such party, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT; NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES

This Contract is the entire agreement between the parties concerning its subject matter, supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, whether written, and is not intended to confer upon any person other than the parties any rights or remedies hereunder.

MODIFICATION OR CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT:

This contract constitutes the entire agreement between all parties and supersedes all previous contract(s). No amendment or modification changing its scope or terms shall have any force or effect unless it is in writing and signed by both parties. This contract may be cancelled by either party with 30 days written notice, delivered by registered mail. In the event of cancellation, the COUNCIL shall be compensated on a pro rata basis for the percentage of Responsibilities performed prior to the date of cancellation. 

Introduction

This report is a summary of the services provided by Black Hills Council of Local Governments (BHCLG) from January 1, 2023, through December 2023. The document contains general organization information, regional service highlights, and specific work activities listed by county.

Background

BHCLG is a voluntary association of county and municipal governments that was established in 1972. The nine (9)-county region is a U.S. Economic Development Administration designated "Economic Development District." BHCLG is considered a "quasi-governmental" organization.

Services

BHCLG provides the following technical and administrative assistance:

- Grant & Loan Application Writing
- Project Administration
- Research & Information Source
- Land Use Planning & Ordinance Development
- Comprehensive Planning
- Mitigation Planning
- HazMat Plan Updates
- Redistricting Assistance
- Annexation Studies
- Floodplain Management Assistance
- Mapping/GIS (Geographic Information Systems)
- Environmental Reviews
- Strategic Planning
- Davis-Bacon Act Monitoring

Funding

BHCLG is financed through membership dues, administrative charges, state and federal agency service contracts, special purpose grants, and technical assistance fees. The 2023 expense budget was \$497,058, of that 87% is used for personnel. Approximately 26.5% of BHCLG funding comes from local government dues.

2023 Highlights

The following programs, services, and administrative activities were provided throughout the region:

- A total of 70 applications were prepared.
- Successful proposals resulted in \$110,586,587 of outside funding from January 2023 to December 2023.
- BHCLG received an additional \$232,565 in direct funding.
- BHCLG's administration of the regional CEDS and cooperation with BHCED and SBDC program partners resulted in loans closed that accounted for 94 retained and 50 new jobs. BHCED has a loan portfolio totaling \$70,591,753 and a total of 121 loans.
- District staff has continued in-person meetings whenever necessary. Zoom meetings have played a larger role in day-to-day activities. Specific metrics were not tracked, but this method of communicating with members played a significant role in meeting the significant increase in work activity caused by stimulus funds.
- Two (2) county Mitigation Plans were completed this year and funding was secured for three (3) more counties.
- Four (4) cities and counties were assisted with land use planning or municipal ordinances assistance, creation, or revisions.
- Three (e) communities and counties were assisted with comprehensive planning.
- Numerous local governments and private businesses were assisted with registering/updating of the System for Award Management. SAM requires active status to be eligible for federal program application and award.
- Provided on-going information on numerous grant and loan programs available to cities and counties in the region.
- Participated in County Association meetings and Municipal League district meetings in the region.

Overall Funding Total

Since 2000, BHCLG has assisted its membership in obtaining \$621,486,497 in outside funding assistance. This figure represents \$3,144 for every person in the region (based on 2020 Census population data). It also results in a return on investment for our members at a ratio of \$358 to \$1.

To the Honorable Commissioner:

I am the sole property owner of 11323 US Highway 18, Edgemont, SD7735; under your jurisdiction in Fall River County. I am writing to request for a refund for the property tax I paid in 2022 and 2023. I occupied this homestead since October of 2021, the contract was finalized in November 2021 where I subsequently applied for exemption. South Dakota has been my domiciliary state since 2019.

According to SDCL 10-4-40 which states that:

Partial exemption of dwellings owned by certain disabled veteran.

"One hundred thousand dollars of the full and true value of the total amount of the dwelling or portion thereof that is owned and occupied for the full calendar year in which the tax is levied by a veteran who is rated as permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected disability is exempt from property taxation."

I served our country honorably and due to such service, I incurred injuries which rendered me totally and permanently disabled. I have a 100% rating for suffering Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and 100% disability on my physical injuries.

Additionally, the code provides that:

33A-2-18. Bonus amount for the veteran with service connected disability.

Notwithstanding the provisions of § 33A-2-15, if any veteran qualifies for a bonus pursuant to § 33A-2-13 is rated ten percent or more disabled for service connected disability or disabilities by the veterans administration as a result of wounds or injuries or illness incurred while on active duty in the areas or periods specified in § 33A-2-13 regardless of the length of such service, the veteran's bonus shall be in the amount of five hundred dollars.

With that, I would like to take this privilege to seek relief from the taxes I have paid in the previous years I have stated above and likewise take avail of the bonus as stated in abovementioned provision. I sincerely hope that you deemed my petition with merit as it would greatly provide aid in my current situation. I am single and disabled and limited in every aspect. No longer being in the military totally displaced my entire life, which, I am now trying to rebuild. Although I am disabled, I have been working on someday soon the business I am trying to build will promote Agri-tourism in our county, this will give me a sense of purpose again. It is my ardent wish to give back and serve our country again with every little fiber that is left in me.

I hope that this request be granted. I wish to repay some debts I incurred in repairing the damage in my home two winters' ago where I had to replace an entire water system due to the extreme weather condition and the damage it created on my basement. I likewise hope that I can continue working without the aid of a small business loan nor collect an unemployment or disability from Social Security which I qualify for but did not take avail of.

Thank you so much for including this matter in your agenda and I pray for your favorable consideration.
