Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to hire Darwin Coy as Full-time Emergency Manager at a rate of \$50,000.00/year, effective 11/21/2024.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve writing a letter to the South Dakota Department of Transportation and the contractor of the street project regarding disappointment of the poor condition that part of the east parking lot was left in. Roll call was taken. With Allen and Russell voting no, all others voting yes, motion carried.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Russell, to set a hearing for late applicant Retail On-Off Sale Wine and Cider license for 2025 on December 5, 2024 at 9:35 a.m.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve the wage increase for Hayley Rough Surface, Jailer, from \$21.00/hr to \$21.75/hr, effective 12/14/2024 as per Union Contract.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Greenough, to approve the surplus to sell the following items from the Extension Department: IBM Wheelwriter 10 Typewriter, asset tag #0648; Canon Color Image Scanner, asset tag #1931; Canon Calculator, asset tag #1805; Logitech Internet 350 Keyboard, no tag; 3 Laptop Computer bags, no tags.

There were 2 County Assistance/Death Expense requests presented to the Board.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Cope, to deny County assistance for CP 2024-07 and CP 2024-08. Roll call was taken. With Russell voting no, all others voting yes, motion carried.

Lyle Norton, Sheriff, met with the Board. He expressed his appreciation for many years of working with Frank Maynard, Emergency Manager.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve the purchase of office furniture from Office

Depot/OfficeMax to furnish the Dispatch Center in the amount of \$2,666.44.

Norton then provided the jail census. There are a total of 14 inmates, 9 males and 4 females, with 1 male in Meade County. He then provided updates. There will be contractors visiting the South Annex to provide quotes for Electrical work that will need to be done to accommodate the new Dispatch location. He reported that there was a large group of employees that moved furniture, etc. to get the new location ready. He also stated that the Dispatch budget was going to have a surplus of about \$20,000.00 that should cover the costs of the work being done and the furniture purchases. Falkenburg requested that Norton get the vehicles that are at the end of the north parking lot out of there. Lastly, Norton requested that he be included in Executive Session for discussion on personnel.

Frank Maynard, Emergency Manager, met with the Board to introduce Dar Coy, the new Emergency Manager, to everyone. He expressed his appreciation to the entire county and everyone that he had met along the way. Maynard then notified the Board that the County had submitted a grant and, due to attendance, the County received an award of \$500.00 from LEPC. He presented a letter offering his assistance in training Coy.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to approve hiring Maynard on an as needed basis for up to 25 hours at \$20.00/hr.

Maynard then provided reports on fires and incidents along with updates.

Brett Blessing, Highway Foreman, met with the Board.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve hiring Edward Hogan as a full-time Highway Department Heavy Equipment Operator at \$22.00/hr, effective 11/12/2024.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Cope, to retroactively approve travel for Tony March, Highway Superintendent, to attend Local Road Conference in Sioux Falls, to include lodging of \$265.08.

Fuel quotes were provided for 8,000 gallons of gasoline: Nelson's Oil & Gas quoted \$2.9557/gallon; Vollan Oil quoted \$2.6204/gallon and MG Oil did not provide a bid.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Falkenburg, to approve and accept the low bid from Vollan Oil at \$2.6204/gallon.

Blessing then provided updates to include the work being done on Argyle Road. The gravel is all crushed limestone and seems to be working well.

The time being 9:30 a.m., the Supplement and Contingency Hearing occurred.

She requested that the State's Attorney sign the documentation and then get a copy of the signed contract to her.

Marie Grace Donnelly, County Resident, met with the Board to request a refund of the Veteran's Tax Exemption on Schultz Tract 1 in Section 29, T8S, R3E, BHM, Fall River County, South Dakota.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Greenough, to deny Donnelly's request for refund.

Motion made by Greenough, seconded by Russell, to enter into Executive Session as per SDCL 1-25-2 (1) personnel and SDCL 1-25-2 (3) legal at 10:38 a.m.

Falkenburg exited the meeting at 10:52 a.m.

Russell declared the Board out of Executive Session at 10:59 a.m.

Russell declared the meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.

EXECUTIONS

- 1. Process begins with a CIVIL or SMALL CLAIMS ACTION IN COURT.
- 2. There is a JUDGEMENT on the case in favor of the CREDITOR (person or business owed money) against the DEBTOR.
- 3. The CREDITOR is then able to obtain an EXECUTION, through the Fall River Clerk of Courts, on the JUDGEMENT against the DEBTOR.
- 4. An EXECUTION does not have to be taken out immediately as the CREDITOR has up to 20 years to take out the EXECUTION.
- 5. The CREDITOR then has the responsibility of providing the appropriate SHERIFF'S OFFICE with the ORIGINAL OF THE EXECUTION and at that time it is the responsibility of that sheriff's office to collect the amount owed by the DEBTOR, if possible.
- 6. On every EXECUTION there are COSTS, COMMISSION of 6% of the AMOUNT COLLECTED and INTEREST of 10% above and beyond the JUDGEMENT AMOUNT. The COUNTY'S COSTS, attorney fees, filing fees, etc., can be recovered on the JUDGEMENT
- 7. The INTEREST on an EXECUTION goes back to the CREDITOR along with the JUDGEMENT AMOUNT.
- 8. The COSTS AND COMMISSION go back to the county that the EXECUTION was worked in, i.e. Fall River County, Custer County, etc.
- 9. The sheriff's office office has a lot of power to collect from the DEBTOR and there are several rules that apply to collecting debt on an EXECUTION that limit the sheriff's office's power.

THE CREDITOR (FALL RIVER COUNTY) WILL HAVE TO FILE SMALL CLAIMS ACTION OR A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST THE DEBTOR



THERE IS A JUDGMENT ENTERED IN FAVOR OF THE CREDITOR IF THE SMALLS CLAIMS OR CIVIL ACTION IS DECIDED IN FAVOR OF THE CREDITOR



THE CREDITOR CAN THEN OBTAIN AN EXECUTION FROM THE FALL RIVER COUNTY CLERK OF COURTS



THE CREDITOR THEN PROVIDES THE APPROPRIATE SHERIFF'S OFFICE THE ORIGINAL COPY OF THE EXECUTION, IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THAT SHERIFF'S OFFICE TO ATTEMPT TO SATISFY THE DEBT OWED TO THE CREDITOR AND RETURN THAT MONEY TO THE CREDITOR



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



The above Typical Road Section and Typical Approach Detail (below) shall be followed in the construction of roads to be placed on the County Road System. Road design shall be consistent with published Standards of the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials. Road construction materials and methods shall conform to the current published edition the "Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges" of the South Dakota Department of Transportation, when referenced in the Standards below. RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO EID LIVESTOCK TAGS

WHEREAS: The traceability program is incremental. USDA APHIS stated on its website, updated October 11th, 2024 after approving the new rule, that it "is committed to implementing a modern system that tracks animals from birth to slaughter", and

WHEREAS: The cost of EID tags disproportionately burdens small and medium sized independent farmers and ranchers. The USDA rule allows large, corporate-owned herds to be grouped and tagged as one group, creating huge loophole that keep costs low for larger companies, and

WHEREAS: The EID mandate would potentially interfere with price discovery found in traditional markets, thereby furthering vertical integration of the US food supply at the expense of the consumer and independent producer, and

WHEREAS: The EID mandate is far overreaching, intrusive and potentially circumvents privacy laws, threatening the livelihood independent cattle and bison producers, and

WHEREAS: Independent, family-owned cattle ranches are of paramount importance to our local economy and to the economy as a whole, and

WHEREAS: The comments received by USDA APHIS in the rulemaking process were overwhelmingly against the new rule, and

WHEREAS: America has the safest and highest quality meat in the world using our current, fully functioning and effective traceability system. The mandated rule claims to be about animal health, but does nothing to prevent or treat disease, and

WHEREAS: South Dakota Codified Law 40-3-27 provides for identification of animals and premises involved in animal movement. The Animal Industry Board may develop and implement specific programs for the identification of animals and premises involved in animal movements. Any program implemented pursuant to §§ 40-3-27 to 40-3-29, inclusive, must provide for confidentiality of identification records other than those records requested by law enforcement officers of the state and those records used for mandatory disease control or eradication efforts. A livestock owner may choose to identify animals using any methods set forth in 9 C.F.R. part 86, as adopted on January 9, 2013, as well as any additional methods that are later approved by the South Dakota Animal Industry Board pursuant to this section, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Fall River County Commission vehemently opposes the implementation of any EID mandate by the USDA, with the suggestion that funds currently earmarked for this program be reallocated to efforts to restore import standards that protect all livestock producers and consumers from introduction to foreign animal disease.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The Fall River County Commission requests that all elected Republican Representatives make every effort to block this government overreach by the Biden/Harris Administration's USDA.

However, on closer examination, we totaled the Presidential race ballots on our sheets to be 667 and remembered there were approximately 3 no votes (undervotes) on ballots which would total 670. If we take the 670 ballots that we thought we audited, less the 645 from the tabulator total, the difference is 25. We must have counted a batch of 25 ballots twice. Therefore, we believe that we erroneously added votes to all race totals.
