The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on January 16, 2025. Present: Joe Allen, Les Cope, Joe Falkenburg, Deb Russell, Sandra Wahlert and Sue Ganje, Auditor.

Wahlert gave an invocation prior to the meeting.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve paying \$2,150.00 to the Kirk Funeral Home in Rapid City for #CP 2025-01. With Cope and Wahlert voting no, all others voting yes, motion carried.

Tony March, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Allen, to approve the application for road approach permit from John Bery on the south side of Erskine Road (County Road #17) to serve a residence.

Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell, to move the permit to occupy County Highway Right-of-Way from Golden West Telecommunications for numerous locations. The Board would like to have the presenter there to go over all of the locations at the next meeting.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve the purchase of a 2025 Caterpillar 308-07A Trackhoe that includes a 7-year maintenance warranty in the amount of \$142,830.33 from Butler Machinery Company. With Cope voting no, all others voting yes, motion carried.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to approve the purchase of a Road Rager Scarifier from DMC Wear Parts LLC in the amount of \$7,500.00.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign Agreement #2025-27-1 with the South Dakota Game Fish & Parks regarding Shep's Canyon Road with a 50/50 cost share, not to exceed \$22,000.00.

March then let the Board know that he will be bringing propane bids to the next meeting.

Lyle Norton, Sheriff, met with the Board to provide updates and the jail census of 20 inmates. With 18 male 5 female in house, 1 female in Pennington County and 1 male in Meade County. The new Dispatch Center is up and running at the South Annex location.

Dar Coy, Emergency Manager, met with the Board. Jamie Mueller from the American Red Cross brought in smoke detectors that the Red Cross donated to the County to use where needed. He provided a listing of items that are eligible for Homeland Security funding for the Board to reference when various requests come in for purchasing. He reported that there were over 30 people in attendance for the LEPC meeting that occurred. Spearfish Electric visited the Oelrichs siren site and determined that a new electrical board is needed to get it operational. Since it's an item that needs to be fixed, he told them to go ahead and get it ordered. Coy will bring the invoice to a future meeting for the Board. He then reported regarding the bids for fire alarm and sprinkler systems in the Courthouse and Jail. The South Dakota Fire Marshall received an anonymous complaint stating that the fire system was not working properly. The Fire Marshall notified Coy that the County needs to take action on the insufficiencies. The Board took no action regarding the Single Signature Form or approval of the 2025 list of volunteers for Emergency Management assistance that were presented. Those items will be placed on the next agenda.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Russell, to approve the following quotes from Rapid Fire Protection: Alarm System – Kidde FX-5 for the County Jail in the amount of \$8,927.00; replacement of fire alarm panel in the Courthouse in the amount of \$10,995.00; and demo dry sprinkler system for the Courthouse in the amount of \$34,690.00.

The time now being 9:30 a.m., the sealed gravel crushing bids were opened. Croell bid \$15.00/ton for DOT agg. Base Course ¾ Gravel Base Sec. 882.2 from the Streeter Quarry and \$15.00/ton for Limestone Ledge Rock Base Course Sec. 882.2 from Streeter Quarry. KD Contractors, Inc. bid \$9.25/ton for DOT agg. Base Course ¾ Base Sec. 882.2 from the West Cheyenne (Angostura Pit) Quarry and \$10.50/ton for Limestone Ledge Rock Base Course Sec. 882.2 from the Sheps Canyon Quarry, Cottonwood Quarry and Collins Quarry; Simon Materials \$9.25/ton for DOT Agg. Base Course ¾ Gravel Base Sec 882.2 from the 1" X 0" from the Maverick Pit and \$11.15/ton for ¾" X 0" from the Loring Quarry and 1" X 0" from the Hot Springs Quarry. March will come back with recommendations at the next meeting.

Allen did not have any new updates on the proposed Jail/Justice Center.

Falkenburg submitted a letter he received that included an offer for rental of office space from Pete Sutherland as he is preparing to retire. The Board said that they didn't have any need for extra office space at this time. Falkenburg also mentioned that Senator Hulse and Representative Ladner have been working on a bill that would provide some tax relief for property owners.

At this time, Cope mentioned that the State of South Dakota is showing interest in possibly creating a Wilderness area near the Mickelson Trail south of Minnekahta junction. He had been told that they are offering a 20-year lease plan for 5,400 acres and wants the County to send a letter to protest it. Lance Russell, State's Attorney will draft a letter that he will bring back to the Board to be approved at the next meeting.

Teresa Pullen, Treasurer, met with the Board.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Wahlert, to authorize the Treasurer's Office to suspend services and close the windows on February 14, 2025, to implement an update from the SD State Vehicle system for training and inventory. Russell requested that it be advertised in the newspaper prior to the closure.

Andersen Engineers met with the Board to present plats for their approval.



Thank you for your participation in the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG) program. Based on feedback from counties and to create increased communications from the SD Office of Emergency Management, we will begin sending a copy of the LEMPG Agreement Matrix Report to county commissions and county emergency managers on a quarterly basis.

This report contains progress reporting, obtained through regular monitoring visits and phone calls between the county emergency manager and their assigned OEM regional coordinator. The report covers the required activities listed in the LEMPG Agreement. In the past, this report has only been shared with county emergency managers. We recognize the grant agreement is agreed upon and signed by county commissions, so we want to ensure the report is provided to both parties.

The initial progress report will be sent in February and subsequent report updates will be provided after each quarterly review.

The LEMPG Agreement requires that <u>All</u> activities need to be completed by the end of the grant performance period for the jurisdiction to receive reimbursement. It is our hope that this additional information will ensure all parties are aware of the activities that are conducted by LEMPG county emergency managers over the course of the year. It will also verify there is agreement between the regional coordinator and county emergency manager regarding completed or outstanding items. We do make every effort to assist counties in completing the necessary grant requirements before deadlines, so dollars are not lost; unfortunately, we do not always see 100% completion of items. These quarterly progress reports will help ensure there are no end-of-grant year county commission surprises.

County emergency managers frequently discuss and meet with their assigned regional coordinator; questions regarding this expanded information process can be directed to them or to Allan Miller, Response Branch Chief. Allan can be reached at allan miller@state.sd.us or 605-995-8990.

#### Subject: Nebraska National Forests and Grasslands Extending Pre-assessment Phase for Plan Revision

The U.S. Forest Service, Nebraska National Forests and Grasslands (NNFG) will extend the pre-assessment phase of our Land Management Pian revision for an unknown time period. Direct efforts related to our Forest and Grassland Land Management Plan revision process will be focused on additional data collection and monitoring to support a future revision. The revision process will eventually continue to move forward. but additional data collection could take as long as 2-4 years. We know this is frustrating and appears to hinder our ability to revise our land management plan in a timely manner, but we intend to use this time to continue fistening to our stakeholders, partners, and users on their thoughts and recommendations for the plan revision. Several stakeholders have expressed interest in providing data and information. We encourage these efforts to continue for assisting in our future decision making.

Primary reasons for extending our assessment and data collection include lack of staff capacity in key resource positions, budget constraints, and hiring limitations. These limiting factors, among others, would make completing a robust revision of the plan in timely manner an unreasonable goal. The decision was made collectively between the U.S. Forest Service Rocky Mountain Region Deputy Regional Forester, Director of the U.S. Forest Service Mountain Planning Service Group (MPSG), and the NNFG Forest Supervisor. The NNFG has every intention of continuing the plan revision process once we have solutions to address the primary finiting factors and the additional supporting data.

To date. NNI'G and MPSG staff have been working diligently to gather data and compile information to complete an assessment, which is a rapid evaluation of existing information about relevant ecological. economic, and social conditions, trends, and sustainability. The completion of an assessment is the first step in a 4-year process to revise an existing land management plan. All of this work to date has not been in vain. Between now and when the NNFG plan revision process moves forward, we will use the infuntation gathered and data gaps identified to:

- Prioritize areas of focus for additional data collection and monitoring information;
- Have conversations with stakeholders around issues and concerns and identify apportunities for collaboration; and
- Bolster future efforts in supporting proposed revisions to the NNFG's current plan.

We appreciate your understanding and patience and look forward to working with you to further sustainable land management practices for multiple uses across our forests and grasslands.

Whereas, the United States Forest Service began the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process for the development of a new Black Hills National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan (BHNFLRMP) years ago;

Whereas, on August 1, 2022, the Fall River County Commission made formal comment, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, opposing the Potential Wilderness Inventory Process document and maps because of the extensive history of mismanagement of the Black Elk Wilderness Area by the Forest Service in the Black Hills National Forest;

Whereas, the Black Elk Wilderness Area mismanagement is well documented and notorious in South Dakota, including but not limited to the incubation of the mountain pine beetle epidemic by Forest Service's non-management of the Wilderness that has cost the adjacent landowners and the State of South Dakota millions of dollars attempting to prevent the spread of the beetle and the destruction of the health of the Forest from depredation and potential catastrophic wildfires;

Whereas, the Black Elk Wilderness Area mismanagement has also caused irreparable harm to South Dakota's tourism industry, as the health and beauty of the Forest has been harmed to such a degree that the National Park Service cancelled fireworks at Mount Rushmore during July 4<sup>th</sup> Independence Day Celebrations;

Whereas, South Dakota's largest economic industry is agriculture, and cattle grazing in the Forest reduces the fuel-load for catastrophic wildfire;

Whereas, cattle grazing and the timber industry are essential in preventing degradation of the Forest and are largely prohibited in Wilderness Areas, as illustrated by recent legal actions by environmental extremists attempting to prevent livestock grazing in Idaho and Montana Wilderness Areas;

Whereas, the Black Hills National Forest in Fall River County has largely avoided much of the depredation from the mountain pine beetle because the Black Elk Wilderness Area is many miles away from the Forest Lands of Fall River County;

Whereas, Forest Service Handbook Section 1909.12 provides that "[n]ot all lands included in the inventory and subsequent evaluations are required to be carried forward in an alternative[;]" and

Whereas, ranch families live in close proximity to the area and roads visibly traverse the area the Forest Service has inventoried for Wilderness in Fall River County and will be burdened by greater risk of depredations and catastrophic fire.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fall River County Commission respectfully request that the Black Hills National Forest eliminate any areas consisting of less than 5,000 acres from the Potential Wilderness Inventory Process Summary, and specifically eliminate the Potential Wilderness Inventory Area in Fall River County, as roads traverse the Area and the occupied ranch headquarters preclude a Congressional Wilderness Declaration pursuant to the Wilderness Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fall River County Commission respectfully request that United State Senator John Thune, United States Senator Mike Rounds, Congressman Dusty Johnson and Governor Larry Rhoden use every option at their disposal to require the Black Hills Forest to eliminate the Potential Wilderness Inventory from any future alternatives considered during the upcoming National Environmental Policy Act Black Hills National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan Process for the all of the above-stated reasons.




