#### FALL RIVER COUNTY UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 20, 2025

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on February 20, 2025. Present: Joe Allen, Les Cope, Joe Falkenburg, Deb Russell, Sandra Wahlert and Sue Ganje, Auditor.

A prayer was given by Wahlert.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve the meeting minutes from February 6, 2025.

There was no action taken on the January, 2025 Auditor's Account with the Treasurer as it was not yet available.

Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell, to approve the wage increase for Morgan Erickson, Certified Assessor, from \$18.35/hr to \$19.10/hr for 1 year anniversary, effective 01/22/2025 as per Union Contract.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to approve the wage increase for Bruce Harris, Heavy Equipment Operator, from \$23.00/hr to \$23.75/hr for 1 year anniversary, effective 02/26/2025 as per Union Contract.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to approve the wage increase for Veronica Quintana, Dispatcher, from \$24.25/hr to \$25.50/hr for 4 year anniversary, effective 03/01/2025 as per Union Contract.

There were no County Assistance/Death Expenses submitted.

Dar Coy, Emergency Manager, met with the Board. He provided the year-to-date LEMPG Matrix progress reports in the Commission packets for them to review. He then reported that the siren in Oelrichs had been repaired. Lastly, he reported that he had attended a Wildfire Evacuation training, which he thought was very good.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to approve and authorize paying the Onsolve (Code Red) invoice, in the amount of \$3,624.64. Coy had indicated that he would like to see the County add the I PAWS alert to our contract. He will come back to the next meeting with the additional amount that would be included in the Onsolve invoice.

Coy then provided updates and reported on incidents, noting that there will be a Defensive Driving Course on March 13, 2025 that all employees will need to attend. There will be 2 times offered so that everyone can attend without having to close offices.

Lyle Norton, Sheriff, met with the Board.

Motion made by Allen, seconded by Wahlert, to approve hiring Janita Holt-Yellow as an Uncertified Dispatcher at \$19.50/hr, effective 03/02/2025.

Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell, to approve hiring Jessica Frevert as an Uncertified Dispatcher at \$19.50/hr, effective 02/17/2025.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to approve hiring Jennifer Campbell as an Uncertified Dispatcher at \$19.50/hr, effective 02/24/2025.

Norton noted the letter of appreciation received from the Hot Springs Amateur Radio Club thanking Melissa Fleming, Dispatcher, for her community education excellence regarding her presentation on 911 dispatch and emergency communication to the Beginners Ham Radio Club class. Falkenburg also expressed gratitude toward Fleming for going above and beyond for the County, on behalf of the Commission.

Norton reported that he had looked into a body scanner to mitigate local Opioid issues. He spoke with Jennifer Sietsma of the Black Hills Council of Local Governments, who assisted with questions of proper usage of the County's Opioid Settlement monies. She believes that the body scanner would fall under the criteria of mitigation. Norton had checked into different devices to find out costs, warranty and maintenance costs. He will bring back his recommendations regarding the one that he feels is the best purchase for the County.

Norton provided updates and the jail census of 13 males and 6 females in house. With 1 male in Meade County and 1 male in Pennington County, for a total of 21 inmates. Lastly, Norton wanted to provide clarification regarding Commissioner Cope's questions for Norton at the last meeting. He had indicated that he saved the County money and made it sound like he over budgeted his departments. He stated that, being short in dispatch, the County didn't have to pay out its' portion of wage-related benefits. This ultimately caused those un-spent amounts to remain in the General Fund. Not meaning to sound like he "saved" the County money.

Tony March, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. He informed them that Brosz Engineering will be sending plans for chip sealing projects.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen, to set a public hearing to accept sealed bids for Chip sealing of County Roads on March 20, 2025 at 9:30 a.m.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Russell, to accept the listing of various equipment costs for providing private services as follows:

March then provided updates. His department's inventory is nearly complete. The first bridge over the irrigation canal, coming from US Hwy 18 heading east on Oral Road has been flagged by Brosz Engineering as a bridge that needs to have changes to maximum tonnage due to weakening structure. He then notified the Board of a Heavy Equipment Operator vacancy, effective 02/14/2025.

Joe Allen, Commissioner, spoke about the proposed Jail/Justice Center. He reported that he had spoken with Sheriff Norton regarding the 2 locations owned by the County that had been recommended to use, one being the Courthouse north parking lot and the other being across the street from the Courthouse in the East parking lot area. They decided to focus on the property across the street from the Courthouse. It is 6 feet above the flood plain for the 100-year flood, FEMA has no data on a 500-year flood. He pointed out that the Brookside Apartments and the Mueller Center are both lower in elevation than the County's property and both were approved for funding. He also spoke to Jennifer Sietsma with the Black Hills Council of Local Governments, and she pointed out that the river has flood control infrastructure through town so, she didn't think it would be a problem. He also mentioned that, with Dispatch being moved to the South Annex, there is no need to include an area for that in the plans. Allen recommended contacting the company for the cost of a 35-bed jail, and a cost for an additional 15 beds. The offices that would need to be included in the plans would be the Clerk of Courts, Sheriff's Office and Judges' chambers. The Director of Equalization's Office could relocate to the second floor of the Courthouse, and they could utilize their current building as part of the new facility. He recommends talking to the company that has built other Justice Center/Jail facilities. Sheriff Norton will talk with them at the Annual Sheriff's Conference.

Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell, to contact Johnson Construction out of Harrisburg, SD to request a cost for an initial assessment to regarding a building for the County.

Joe Falkenburg, Commissioner, asked for the Board's support of the letters that he had written. One being a letter of support for Country-of-Origin meat labeling, with the other being the opposition to lab grown meat.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Wahlert, to approve and sign the letter supporting Country-of-Origin meat labeling and send it to Senator John Thune.

Motion made by Russell, seconded by Cope, to approve and sign the letter opposing lab grown meat and send it to the District 30 Senator and Representatives.

Andersen Engineers did not present any plats as they were not ready yet. They will bring them to the Board in the future.

Dear Officials,

I have been fighting with the Fall River County Department of Equalization and Treasurer for about three years to have a valid assessment of my property in Oelrichs. Every year I have owned the property the Equalization department has overvalued the property and forced me to pay excessive taxes. As I have told you many times, I do not have any objection to paying a fair tax, but I will no longer allow your departments to steal from me using your government offices and duties as a cover to commit theft. The United States of America is based on the principle that it exists "Of the People, By the People, For the People". It is not a Tyrannical, Dictatorial Government, but that is exactly how the Fall River Equalization and Treasury departments are run.

The main cause of your corrupt actions is the old house that is on the property. Even though I have told you many times, and shown you photos that prove, the house is not livable or usable because of a failed/non-existent foundation causing a collapsed floor, you still call it a residence and tax it as such. The house has never been lived in as long as I have owned the property. Every time I have told you this and that I want it's designation changed to an outbuilding, you have done nothing. The legal definition for Residence in 8 U.S. Code § 1101(a)(33) is "The term "residence" means the place of general abode; the place of general abode of a person means his principal, actual dwelling place in fact, without regard to intent." Legally, people have to be able to live in a building for it to be classified as a residence. The old house cannot be lived in.

When I refused to pay the grossly excessive 2023 taxes the Fall River Treasurers office informed me they will apply a lien to the property for these taxes and charge me interest as long as they are not paid. I have tried to pay what I consider an honest tax twice, both times the checks were returned. You are grossly overvaluing my property and using that false assessment

to commit extortion. Extortion is a crime, and just because this is being done by government offices does not excuse this fact.

All of the assessments that the Equalization department has conducted of the property are erroneous, either though incompetence, corruption, or both. Since you refuse to ignore the reality that the house is not a residence, I think corruption is more in line with these actions. The last assessment, where your people left yellow notices at the property, is also wrong. It states the old house was made in 1940 and has one bathroom. The house was built in the early 1900's, if I remember correctly the realtor told me their records showed it was built around 1910. When it was built it did not have plumbing or a bathroom, the bathroom was made as part of an expansion when the kitchen was added. The addition might have occurred in the 1940's, but not the original construction of the house. To the best of my knowledge, and from the work I have done on the house, it is apparent that the addition is when plumbing and propane were added to the house. They converted what was a small room or large closet into a bathroom when the kitchen was added. A propane water heater and floor heater were also installed during this addition. The floor heater is why they cut the main beam holding up the center of the house, they put the floor heater right where the beam use to support the center of the house.

All of the plumbing lines were removed from the house in 2021. The septic lines have also been disconnected, removed or capped off. The bathroom has been disassembled and the fixtures removed. The house would not have a bathroom even if it still had plumbing. The propane tank has also been removed.

The fact that you originally assessed the mobile home I moved onto the property to live in at \$147,500, but then changed the assessment to \$46,960 after I complained, shows that your 'assessments' are nothing more than what you choose to value a property or building at, and not based on the true value. You changed the 'assessment' by \$100,540, that's a 215% error which overvalued the house 316%.

Since the old house is uninhabitable and properly unusable (due to the collapsed floor), I also consider it to be more of liability than an asset. I am sure it will cost more to have it demolished and removed than any value it might add to the property, if it ads any value at all. I have not checked with an independent assessor on this, but the condition of the house might, in reality, lower the value of the property.

When the house was bought in 2021 the market here was very hot and market preices were more than assessed values. I bought the property for \$60,000, and with the acceptable mobile assessment of \$46,960, the property has a market value of about \$110,000. In 2023 you 'assessed' the property at \$241,000. For 2023, if you replace your excessive assessment of the mobile home of \$147,500 with the acceptable assessment of \$46,960 and remove the erroneous assessment of the old house, the tax assessment would be \$69,310. From what I can tell, without having access to your tax rate and computation information, it appears an honest tax for the property in 2023 would be about \$966.66, not the \$3361.20 you are demanding.

In 2024 you 'assessed' the property at \$139,120, this is \$29,120 more than the market value of the property. For 2024, if you remove the 'assessment' of the old house, the tax

assessment is then \$75,760. An honest tax for 2024 would be about \$993.99 not \$1,825.31 as you state.

In your 2021 and 2022 assessments the property was also over-valued. I didn't raise an issue about the taxes back then because the tax you charged seemed to be about right, I didn't know how your assessments worked (I have never received your 2021 assessment), and I was too busy working on getting the mobile home connected and livable to have the time to look closely at the taxes you charged.

For 2021, if the old house was not erroneously listed as a residence, the taxes for the property would be about \$173.69. I was charged, and paid, \$1,046.94. This is about \$873.25 more than an honest tax should have been. For 2022 the taxes for the property would be about \$166.94. I was charged, and paid, \$978.96. This is about \$811.06 more than what should have been charged. Your departments stole around \$1,790.02 from me for the 'taxes' for these years.

I **DEMAND** your departments do the following in regards to the 2023 and 2024 property taxes:

- 1) Permanently change the designation of the old house to outbuilding. This designation cannot change until the time the house is repaired and restored into a livable residence, if it ever is.
- 2) Recalculate the 2023 taxes for the property with the designation of the old house as an outbuilding and the value of the mobile home has been changed to \$46,960. Any interest, penalties and/or fees shall be removed and cannot be added to this tax.
- 3) Recalculate the 2024 taxes for the property after the designation of the old house has been changed to outbuilding.
- 4) After these changes have been made, and the documentation has been sent to me, give me at least 30 days to pay the revised taxes.

IF THESE DEMANDS ARE NOT MET, LEGAL ACTIONS AGAINST YOUR DEPARTMENTS WILL BE STARTED. IN ADDITION TO CORRECTING THE TAXES AND PERMANENTLY MAKING THE DESIGNATION OF THE OLD HOUSE AN OUTBUILDING, THE SUIT WILL INCLUDE PUNITIVE DAMAGES AND ANY AND ALL ATTORNEY, LEGAL AND OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED.

If you agree to the above demands I am will let the excess taxes paid for 2021 and 2022 go. But if legal actions are started these overpayments will be included in the case.

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is a federal agency that works with private landowners to help them conserve, maintain, and improve their natural resources. The NRCS emphasizes voluntary, science-based conservation; technical assistance; partnerships; incentive-based programs; and cooperative problem solving at the community level. Over the next several years, the NRCS will continue to assist landowners, in South Dakota (SD), with conservation activities as part of its conservation program delivery throughout SD. Project activities may include such things as pipelines and watering tanks for livestock, animal waste storage facilities, planning shelterbelts or riparian buffers, grassed waterways, terraces, and other conservation practices.

To assist the NRCS in identifying historic properties (also called cultural resources) that may be important to different communities or groups, we are soliciting public involvement and consultation on our activities. We are asking you to please respond to this letter if your organization has specific concerns related to the location of historic properties. While the SD NRCS has professional cultural resource specialists on staff and each project with the potential to affect historic properties is checked for known archeological sites and national or state register listed properties, local communities are often aware of other resources in their rural areas that have not been previously identified or recorded. If your organization does have locations of cultural resource concerns, please identify these general areas on a town or county map and return the map to our office within 45 days of receipt of this letter. As our office reviews future program applications, the NRCS will identify activities that have the potential to affect historic properties and consult with any identified interested public official on a projectby-project basis. If you have no specific concerns, you may either notify our office of such in writing or simply not respond to this letter. Also, please let the NRCS know if you are aware of any other interested individuals or groups. For your information, similar letters have also been sent to each county auditor.
