

FALL RIVER COUNTY UNAPPROVED MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 8, 2026

The Fall River Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on January 8, 2026. Present: Joe Allen, Les Cope, Joe Falkenburg, Deb Russell, Sandra Wahlert and Sue Ganje, Auditor.

An invocation was given by Wahlert.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m.

The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve the agenda as written.

The meeting was turned over to the Auditor, who asked for nominations for the Chairman of the Board.

Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Allen, to nominate Falkenburg as Chairman.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Russell for nominations to cease. Falkenburg will remain as Chairman for 2026.

The meeting was turned over to Chairman Joe Falkenburg.

Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Allen, to nominate Russell as Vice-Chair.

Motion made by Falkenburg, for nominations to cease, but no second was made. A vote was conducted with all voting yes. Russell will remain as the Vice-Chair for 2026.

The Board reviewed the remainder of the items on the list to approve.

Motion made by Cope, seconded by Allen, to approve the consent agenda First Grouping to include the following: to approve setting the meeting dates on the 1st & 3rd Thursdays of each month, and any other meeting dates designated by the Board; to appoint the Fall River County Herald-Star as the official Newspaper for 2026; to designate the bulletin board on the 1st floor of County Courthouse for legal matters, agendas, notices, etc.; to designate the depositories for the County as First Interstate Bank and Schwab Treasury; to set the prisoner care per day at \$110.00 and \$130.00 as per Sheriff's Office recommendation; to approve Monument Health as the health care facility for the jail, under the direct supervision of Dr. Avery Sides, as primary caregiver for inmates and Fall River Health Services under the supervision of Tina Norton, LPN as the secondary; to approve Tina Norton as the Inmate Contract Nurse, at \$1,500.00/month; to set the ride-a-long fee for prisoner and mental health transports at \$40.00 per day to Rapid City and \$100.00 per day to Yankton and Sioux Falls; to set Indigent burial rate at \$2,150.00 and approve the Commission meeting minutes of December 30th, 2025.

Longevity Pay

Longevity pay, pays for Courthouse employees, Highway Department employees and for the Deputies, Dispatchers, Jailers, Administrative Assistants and Office Manager employed by the Sheriff's Department shall be paid as follows:

- After two (2) years of continuous service with the County, the employee shall be paid thirty-five (\$35) dollars per month equating to \$420.00 per year.

- After five (5) years of continuous service with the County, the employee shall be paid sixty (\$60) dollars per month equating to \$720.00 per year.
- After ten (10) years of continuous service with the County, the employee shall be paid eighty-five (\$85) dollars per month equating to \$1020.00 per year.
- After fifteen (15) years of continuous service with the County, the employee shall be paid one hundred (\$100) dollars per month equating to \$1200.00 per year.
- After twenty (20) years of continuous service with the County, the employee shall be paid one hundred-twenty-five (\$125) dollars per month equating to \$1500.00 per year

There were no County assistance/death expense applications.

Dar Coy, Emergency Manager, met with the Board and gave updates on what he has been working on with FEMA, and on different trainings. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to approve payment for the Hazard Mitigation Plan in the amount of \$10,500.00 (with reimbursement of said amount from the BHCLG). Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Cope, to approve the bi-annual payment to the City of Hot Springs for the airplane hangar rent in the amount of \$1,350.00.

Lyle Norton, Sheriff, met with the Board. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Wahlert, to approve the 2026 Prisoner Housing contract with Pennington County at the rates of \$110.00 and \$130.00. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell, to approve hiring Alexia Barndt as Uncertified Dispatcher in the amount of \$20.25/hr, effective 1/5/2026. Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell, to approve Melissa Fleming donating 40hrs of vacation time to Janita Holt-Yellow for bereavement. Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell to junk the HP Office jet Pro 8610 printer asset tag# 02245, from the Sheriff's Office as it is non-functioning. Norton provided jail census, 11 total inmates, 9 in house, 7 male, 2 female and 2 males in Pennington County.

Tony March, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Russell to approve the purchase of the Leased Belly Dump trailer for \$30,700.00. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Allen to reject the purchase of the 10ft Snowplow from Mike DeBoer in the amount of \$1,00.00 due to DeBoer being employed by the County. Motion made by Russell, seconded by Wahlert, to set the Private Road Work Hearing for Feb. 5, 2026 at 9:40am. Motion made by Wahlert, seconded by Allen, to approve the opening of Annual Bids for Materials set for February 5, 2026 at 9:45am. March thanked Custer County for temporary use of their signs. The Highway Department also hauled materials to recycling, ie. old signs and received \$3,559.00. March then gave updates on projects.

Dave Weishaupl, Maintenance Supervisor, met with the Board to provide a listing of County owned vehicles along with the condition of each vehicle. The Board asked Weishaupl to assess whether each vehicle is worth fixing, needing to be sold, etc.

Teresa Pullen, Treasurer, met with the Board. Pullen discussed Designation of Banks, 89 distress warrants equaling around \$32,000.00 that would be collected. Liability Report for 2026 and update an update on tax certificates that she is working on for an upcoming public auction. She updated the board on the progress of purchasing Tyler Technologies software and the current contract with T Tech. Motion made by Allen, seconded by Russell to approve hiring Alexandra Forbey as Administrative Assistant at a rate of \$16.75/hr, effective 2/2/2026.

Maternal and Child Health Program:

The Pregnancy Care Program continues to be available in Fall River for pregnant and postpartum women. This program uses a research-based curriculum for education. We receive referrals for this program from various sources, including Medicaid, doctors' offices, and the WIC program, among others. Once we receive a referral, we make multiple attempts to contact the woman and inform her about the program.

The Pregnancy Care Program provides an excellent opportunity for pregnant women to connect with a registered nurse at least once a month throughout their pregnancy. The nurse provides personalized education, support, and referrals to local resources. During these monthly visits, the nurse completes a weight check, a blood pressure check, an assessment, and maintains regular communication with the woman's healthcare provider. On average, we have a caseload of two pregnant women a month.

For postpartum services, there is a visit available for postpartum women and their infants after delivery. This visit focuses on education related to postpartum care and newborn care. It is also a great opportunity to receive support and education on breastfeeding. In August, Jackie completed a 20-hour breastfeeding counselor training course, which enhanced her knowledge and skills to support breastfeeding families.

We continue to promote and provide safe sleep education to families. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that infants sleep in the parents' room but on a separate sleep surface for the first six months. We continue to share the Department of Health Wake Safe campaign, which launched last year, which emphasizes the ABC acronym (Alone, Back, Crib) to encourage safe sleep practices consistently.

All pregnant women who are enrolled in the Pregnancy Care Program are screened for safe sleep and receive education beginning at 28 weeks gestation and continuing postpartum, ensuring their baby has a safe sleep environment. If it is determined that an infant needs a safe sleeping arrangement, our office can provide a portable crib, known as a Cribette.

Our office continues to offer car seats to families in need, offering a variety of options to support the growth of children. Our convertible car seat is safe for infants from Birth up to 65 pounds and can be used both front and rear facing. Additionally, we have no back booster seats available for children who are at least four years old and weigh a minimum of 80 pounds.

We also continue to offer developmental screenings using the Ages and Stages Questionnaire. These screening tools help assess children 5 years of age and younger for growth/development and social/emotional issues, reassuring parents that their child is on track or identifying any necessary referrals for intervention. We also provide fluoride varnish for children 6 years and younger, which is an effective way to protect their teeth from decay. We encourage more families to take advantage of this service.

Immunization Activities:

Our office is committed to providing immunization to children up to 18 years old. We offer vaccines to children who qualify for federal Vaccine for Children (VFC) program, as well as those with in-network insurance providers. To be eligible for the VFC program, a child must be uninsured, underinsured, Medicaid-eligible, or be an American Indian or Alaska Native. This program is a wonderful opportunity for families to get their children vaccinated at no cost for the vaccine, helping to protect them from preventable diseases.

Our office is sending our monthly reminders to families who children are behind on immunizations. We make a minimum of three contact attempts to get them an appointment scheduled. We continue to work on increasing our immunization rate in Hot Springs for those children 19-47 months old.

In May, South Dakota reported its first case of measles in recent years. To help protect the community against this highly contagious disease, we hosted one measles vaccination clinic in Hot Springs. These clinics were open to anyone in the community needing a measles vaccination.

School Health Activities:

I continue to have school hours at Edgemont and Oelrichs. In September, I was able to complete school assessments, which included vision and hearing screenings at Edgemont.

Additionally, I also work with the schools in this area to review their immunization records. This process ensures that students have received the required immunizations for school entry. If any student is identified as not complying, we notify the school health official for them to complete follow-up with the family. The school staff does an excellent job ensuring that students meet their immunization requirements and that all required paperwork is filled out and submitted to our office.

Public Health Preparedness and Emergency Response:

Jackie is currently participating in the Fall River County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). The LEPC will be hosting a Point of Distribution (POD) exercise at the Mueller Center in Hot Springs on October 22nd, where free flu shots will be offered to the community.

General Public Health Office Activities:

Reminder, our office offers flu shots, which is the best way to protect yourself, your family, and the community. The flu season runs from October to May. For more information on how to protect yourself and to stay updated on flu activity in the local area, please visit <https://doh.sd.gov/topics/diseases/infectious-diseases/influenza/>.

We continue to refer families who qualify to WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) and the Bright Start programs.





The above Typical Road Section and Typical Approach Detail (below) shall be followed in the construction of roads to be placed on the County Road System. Road design shall be consistent with published Standards of the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials. Road construction materials and methods shall conform to the current published edition the "Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges" of the South Dakota Department of Transportation, when referenced in the Standards below. Copy of these Specifications is on file at the County Highway Department Office.

The following are standards which shall be met:

1. Maximum Grade of any road or portion of road shall not exceed ten percent (10%)
2. Maximum Degree of Curvature shall not exceed twenty one degrees (21 degrees)
3. Crown rates shall be between 0.02 11/11 to 0.06 11/11. Maximum Super elevation rate in curves shall be 0.07 11/11.
4. Culverts shall be sized to assure proper drainage. The minimum size of culvert shall be eighteen inches (18") in diameter. Although fifteen inch (15") diameter will be allowed under certain conditions.
5. Gravel Surfacing shall meet the requirements of Part B of the Standard Specifications.
6. Asphalt and Concrete construction methods and materials shall meet the requirements of Part C and Part D of the "Standard Specifications".
7. All Dead-End Roads shall have Cul-De-Sacs with a minimum constructed radius of fifty feet (50').
8. Approaches shall be constructed perpendicular as practical to the County Road.
9. The Minimum dedicated Right-Of-Way width shall be sixty six feet (66').



TYPICAL APPROACH DETAIL

1. Only one approach shall be allowed to each tract or parcel of land.
2. Existing roadway drainage will be maintained. Culverts shall be sized to assure proper drainage. The maximum size of culvert shall be eighteen inches (18") in diameter, although fifteen inch (15") diameter will be allowed under certain conditions. The minimum length of approach culvert shall be thirty-two feet (32').
3. Sight distance of approaches shall meet published Standards of the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials.







Last spring, Department of Agriculture & Natural Resources (DANR) published notice of proposed uranium exploration (EXNI 453) in Fall River County, near Craven Canyon. Publication of the notice provided for public comment and petitions to intervene in the decision-making process. It also provided for a venue change request from an affected county.

In a letter dated May 14, the Oglala Lakota County Commission, which is situated downwind and downstream from the proposed site, timely and properly submitted a request to hold the hearing in Pine Ridge, Hot Springs (their county seat), or Rapid City.

SDCL 45-6D-27 states, in part, “The board of county commissioners of a county containing affected land may request that the hearing on the application for a uranium exploration operation permit be held in that county.”

At an August, 2025 pre-hearing on the matter, Board of Minerals & Environment Hearing Chair Bob Morris denied the request of Oglala Lakota County as improper because it did not come from the county in which the exploration is sited. However, SDCL 45-6D-27 clearly states that the request may come from a county “affected” by the project, not simply the county in which the project is specifically sited.

In a letter to the Board dated October 15, 2025, the Fall River County Board of Commissioners wrote to support Oglala Lakota County’s venue change request, stating that “...a venue in western South Dakota would best serve all involved in the matter and create the most equitable circumstance for Tribes and the general public.” The City Council of Hot Springs also wrote in support.

Despite these requests, our support of Oglala Lakota County’s timely & proper venue change request was denied in a December 21st ruling from Hearing Chair Morris, citing an earlier deadline that Oglala Lakota County did, in fact, meet.

Pursuant to ARSD 74:09:01:08, the Fall River County Board of Commissioners respectfully requests reconsideration of venue change requests by the full Board of Minerals & Environment, and to grant Oglala Lakota County’s request to relocate the hearing on EXNI 453 to Hot Springs.
